

**MRS. FRANKIE YEARNES
DIES: 89 YEARS OLD**

Frankie Yearns 89, of Queen City died Thursday evening in a rest home at Memphis following a lingering illness.

The daughter of William and Margaret (Slighton) Figge, she was born in Schuyler County on August 29, 1875. On April 11, 1901 in Queen City, she was married to Carl A. Yearns and to this marriage seven children were born.

Surviving are four sons, Henry, Glenn and Paul Yearns, all of Queen City, and Junior Yearns of Burley, Ida; three daughters, Mrs. Guy (Bertha) McElhinney of Declo, Ida., Mrs. Henry (Freda) Myers of Queen City and Mrs. Ralph (Wilma) Anderson of Downing; 14 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband who died July 26, 1956; five sisters and four brothers.
