


Join us on Sunday, July 13th at the Lorenzo Historic Site for the Annual CVCA Summer picnic!

CVCA Members Out & About

Road-tripping to TRYON!

At the end of April 2025, myself, along with another CVCA member, Deb Marcuccilli, took a "road trip" to Mill Spring, N.C. to the famous Tryon International Equestrian Center, (TIEC). Deb was entered as a competitor in the 2025 Katydid CDE. I went along to help Deb and to "experience" TIEC. I had also signed up to volunteer during the competition. With my strong belief and desire to volunteer, since I was there, and knowing that any equine related competition always needs volunteers, I decided why not? My volunteer experience was awesome! (More on that later!)

I don't know of any CVCA members that have ever had the chance to compete or even just "visit" TIEC. As I was told by another horsey friend, going to TIEC is a must see to believe! She was absolutely right! Wow! Located approximately 10 miles from the nearest town. It is basically in the middle of nowhere! The place is designed to function as its own village/town. There are 1- and 2-bedroom cabins near the front entrance of the complex. 3-5-bedroom cabins located in the back corner of the property. A brand-new hotel with a couple of restaurants is located close to the largest indoor arena that I've ever seen! There is also an area for those people wishing to bring campers and RVs. Further into the center of the complex are various specialty shops and boutiques. A "department style" store where one can buy anything with the Tryon name on it. T-shirts, sweatshirts, baseball caps, etc. As well as other articles of clothing, boots...you get the picture. Across the parking lot is the General Store. Food, drink and other things can be purchased there. In this building there was a Starbucks coffee shop. Which became my daily morning must stop for my newly discovered favorite coffee drink.... Latte! A great way to start the day!

Also located nearby to the General Store, are more restaurants, an old-fashioned diner, and an event space and a place to enjoy "adult" beverages. On site, there are at least 10 huge barns for stabling. Numerous outdoor warm-up rings as well as competition rings. There is a main outdoor coliseum, where stadium jumping events are held. A cross-country jumping course. Alongside which, the permanent driving obstacles are set.

Just a bit of history about TIEC: The site was built in 2015, in anticipation for the World Equestrian Games that were going to be held on site in 2018. 2025 is the sites 10th anniversary. It really is quite the spectacular place! There seems to be always some type of equine event going on. While we were there, the CDE was the only equine competition happening. Though, there were a few hunter/jumper groups there schooling, in preparation for an upcoming show.

For anyone unfamiliar with what a CDE is, here is a brief description: driving events over a 3-day period. Day 1: Driven Dressage. Day 2: Cross Country Obstacles. (Oh! The obstacles at Tryon!) Day 3: Cones

As far as my volunteering "assignment": I was 1 of 4 people scribing for Friday's driven dressage. Having never scribed before, I was a bit anxious if I would be up to the task. I'm happy to report that my volunteering experience, and specifically scribing for dressage was an absolute awesome experience!! I scribed for Marcie Quist, well known national and international, ADS and FEI driving official and judge, as well as Chef d'equip for many USA world teams. I learned so much from Marcie! My head was filled to capacity with her comments and suggestions. Wow! Just wow!

Now, to talk about Deb Marcuccilli's competition! Because that is why I was at Tryon!

Deb was competing in the Para division, single pony, with her wonder pony, DuraMax! Of course, in the days leading up to the start of competition, there was rain!! Ugh! I guess that we, here in the northeast weren't immune to rainy weather! All the rain caused/created very challenging conditions for the course designers as well as for all the competitors. The challenge was specifically with the cross-country course. There was mud! Lots of mud! And, standing water in and around a few of the obstacles. For 2 different obstacles, they were designed to have standing water within the obstacle. Even with a couple days of sunshine, wind and warm temperatures, adjustments needed to be made. A couple of obstacles were deemed not safe to be driven and the course re-routed, with time adjustments made. Trust me, even with a couple of obstacles removed, the remaining obstacles were very challenging! And crazy! The driving that I witnessed from all competitors was awesome! Especially jaw-dropping was watching the one 4-in-hand team navigating through the obstacles! Again...wow! Just wow!

Day 1 was driven dressage. Deb's driven dressage went well. (Though, I know she would differ with me on this.) Day 2 was cross-country. Her driving on the cross-country course was beyond impressive. Another wow from me! Since I had a golf cart to use, I zipped over and around the cross-country course to make it to watch most her of obstacle runs. The 3rd and final day of competition was the very impressive and challenging cones course. The cones course was setup in the main outdoor coliseum. Course designer Marc Johnson certainly wanted to challenge all the drivers! He held nothing back in creating the course! Big sweeping turns, as well as challenging tighter turns. Cone sets tight together. Others spaced with a lot of distance between them. Serpentines. Many changes of rein. Once again, Deb, after carefully walking the course multiple times planning the best course for her and Max, had an awesome drive. Yay! Competition complete! Now, to wait for the final results! The final result for Deb and Max: First place in the Para driving division! Congrats!! Well done!

In conclusion: I had the best time experiencing Tryon and the Katydid CDE competition! My thanks to Deb for inviting me along. A trip that will certainly be remembered! In fact, a return trip being planned for September!
