A Night at Home... Talking harness with Myrna Rhinehart

Thursday evening, February 20th, found several of us CVCA members and a few guests, dreaming of the glorious good driving weather that is ever so slowly making its way towards us. CVCA hosted Myrna Rhinehart, of IVC Carriage, for an excellent presentation of Harness Selection and Maintenance. Myrna's slides and wealth of information illustrated her dedication to insuring proper fit and care for a harness. She skillfully took us through the options currently available to us, with a firm conviction that we purchase the best quality harness we can afford at the time, and take good care of it. She pointed out the pros and cons of leather and synthetic – usually it come down to personal preference as to how much time WE want to put into the care. Little details such as box keepers versus open keepers and tongue buckles versus Conway buckles were discussed. Safety of the harness, old or new, and comfort for the horse were strongly emphasized. She compared a poorly fitted browband to having to wear uncomfortable shoes that don't fit – no matter how one tries to deal with it, a bad pair of shoes just hurt with every step!

Myrna walked us through the proper measurements needed to ensure a great harness fit for our equine partner. She stressed the use of the middle hole – a good harness fit will have the harness piece buckled at the middle hole with a hole or two above and below to go larger or smaller as our ponies change. Trimming the ends of the strap make for a tidy looking harness and won't catch the reins. It really is the little things that make the difference.

Myrna offers several insightful and educational articles on the IVC website. They are free for the browsing. Please check them out. Myrna wrapped up her presentation with an opportunity to ask questions – many of us took advantage of her depth of knowledge. I know I have a far better idea of what I will be doing for my future harness. Our CVCA raffle will be a one hundred dollar gift certificate to IVC. Tickets will be available starting at the March Membership Meeting. I plan to buy several – I will put that gift certificate towards the purchase of a custom leather harness that will last beyond my lifetime!

Passing of Joyce Fisher CVCA Charter Member

Joyce B. Fisher, 95, of Cazenovia, died on January 22, 2025 at her home surrounded by family. She was a life-long resident of the Central New York area. She was the only child of Geoffrey M. Brown and Elsie Folsom Brown. Joyce was born in 1929 in Syracuse and graduated from Fayetteville High School in 1947, serving as the yearbook editor for that year. She then attended and graduated from the Maxwell School of Citizenship at Syracuse University.

While in college, she devoted many years of service to helping the University's foreign students adjust to their new lives in the USA and she formed relationships with many of them that lasted all her life. She was a member of Pi Beta Phi sorority. She spent many hours dancing to the big bands of the era at the Hotel Syracuse. Ballroom dancing was one of her passions for the rest of her life, too.

While at Syracuse, she met her future husband, Tom Vickers from Newcastle, England. They were married in 1957. Joyce was initially employed by the Syracuse Savings Bank and then the Manlius Military School – both places she admired and loved working for. After her marriage, she became a stay-at-home mother for her two small boys (Geoffrey and David).

After Tom's unexpected death in 1970, Joyce relied on her parents to help raise her sons until she remarried in 1974 to Robert H. Fisher. They bought a small farm in the Town of Nelson where she resided until her death.

Beginning in 1974, she converted her life-long passion of dressage and teaching into a more formal career. Over the next 45 years, she would influence scores of students in equitation and more profoundly, in their lives. Many of these students became life-long friends. She is survived by her son, Geoffrey and daughter-in law Sarah, and by her son David. She is also survived by her two grandchildren, Evan Vickers of New Hampshire and Andrea (Tyler) Massey of Kentucky.


