For just over 2 weeks, from the end of August 2025, until the early part of September, I had the most awesome experience! I attended the world championships for Para drivers, as well as the European 4 in hand championships. Both events were held in Lahden, Germany, over the course of 4 days. September 4-7. Fellow CVCA member, Deb Marcuccilli was named to the US National Para driving team, and in turn, Deb asked me to go along! How absolutely lucky was I? I was very honored and grateful to be asked by Deb! I was a member of Team USA! (And, I have the official team attire to prove it!)  $\bigcirc$ 

This trip would be my first, ever to Europe! The excitement that I felt was over the top! I was looking forward to everything about this trip! With my knowledge of Combined driving limited, I looked forward to learning so much more about Combined driving. And, I did! But there is still so much more to learn!

The first week was spent in the Netherlands at Stal de Ronde. The farm is owned and operated by Koos and Marie de Ronde, as well as their children and Koos' parents. Koos is a top 4 in hand driver in Europe. (He competed at the 4 in hand championship at Lahden, as well). Marie is a well known International judge and TD. Deb leased a horse from Koos for the competition. Tjibbe is part of Koos' indoor CDE team, as the left front leader. Also at the farm, working with Koos in preparation for the competition was Deb's USA team member Diane Kastama. Diane also leased a horse from Koos for the competition. Freedom, or Freeddy as he is known was Diane's driving partner for the competition.

Janelle Marshall, representing Australia for the pony championships was also at the farm preparing for the pony world championship, which was held 2 weeks after the Lahden championship. She represented her "home" country, but she has lived in the US for over 20 years, residing in Aiken, S.C.


Janos Poppa, a 4 in hand driver from Hungry was also at Stal de Ronde, getting coaching and tips from Koos in order to improve his performance at the upcoming European 4 in hand championship at Lahden.

Being introduced and "hanging out" with all these different carriage drivers, from various locations around the world, was truly a wonderful time!

So many memories! Such an adventure! This experience is one that I shall forever hold dear! There aren't enough words to express how thankful, appreciative and grateful I am to Deb for asking me to be part of this adventure! Thanks Deb!!

I have so much more that I could share with the CVCA membership. But I'll leave that to Deb to share her story with everyone!





#### MY EUROPEAN (DEFINITELY NOT A) VACATION

As a means of introduction: I am a new-2 year-member of CVCA.I am also very new to driving. I have been fortunate to own/ride horses since I was a teen. I lost my riding mare in 2021 and-looking for a way to stay connected to horses-started driving with Sarah Reitz..FOR FUN.

Sarah took me on as a student-older(now 70) and with a disability- I have 2 prosthetic legs-with no hesitation. She introduced me to combined driving..I had NEVER heard of it.I had seen/heard about the ECHO competitions on Facebook and it looked like fun.

The first year I was able to compete at a couple of ECHO's with Witt's pony Captain. I was HOOKED!

The second year I leased Remington. 'Remy' had lost his owner and I felt like he needed a new human to love him. Remy and I did EVERYTHING in 2022. I told Sarah I wanted to go wherever she was willing to take me. We competed at every

ECHO..Gladstone..Bromont..Lorenzo..Orleton and even Tryon! He finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the nation for Training pony. It was at Tryon that I 'caught the eye' of one of the show organizers. She was aware that I was a 'para' driver and suggested that I consider applying as a competitor for the 2025 Para World Championships. I LAUGHED

Quick explanation here. Para drivers are drivers with a disability. Individuals need to be evaluated and classified by qualified-as defined by USEF and FEI-physical therapists. I had been classified in Florida as a Grade II. There are 2 grades for combined driving. Grade I is individuals with a greater disability than Grade II. Apparently, when I was classified..it put me 'on the map' so to speak.

I continued to show in 2023 and 2024-and was now leasing Sarah's pony Fferm Gwenffrwd Duramax(MAX). I knew that Sarah was going to submit an application for the Pony World Championships(9/17-21)-so-I figured-what do I have to lose-I'll apply for the Para World Championships(9/4-7).

Against all odds-noone was more surprised than me-I was picked for the 3 person team to represent the USA! This was a holy %#&@ moment for me. I had made some plans..just in case..but had lots more details to figure out. I had contacted a well known driver in the Netherlands..Koos de Ronde..he was willing to lease me a horse. For me to ship Max+carriages would not have been affordable.

Judy Sobczak expressed her willingness (Thank-you God) to be my groom. Bruce Jones..who was already going to be in the Netherlands with Sarah for her competition..agreed to be my navigator.

Judy and I flew out to Amsterdam on 8/25/25. We arrived on 8/26..rented a car..checked in at the hotel..napped a bit..and then headed over to Stal de Ronde (The de Ronde Stable).I can't say enough about the hospitality and support given to me by the whole de Ronde family. Driving is their passion/business and they took me-a complete stranger=under their wing-and did everything possible to ensure that my experience would be positive. They provided the horse,harness,a carriage for dressage/cones as well as a carriage for marathon..plus..shipping to and from the actual show which was in Lahden,Germany..3 hours away. Koos..a world known 4-in-hand driver worked with me every day. Did I mention that I only had 7 days to work with his horse Tjibbe (pronounced Chibbuh)! There were also other U.S. drivers at Stal de Ronde..Diane Kastema(also on the Para team and also leasing a horse from the de Ronde's...Anna Koopman with her own pony preparing for Pony Worlds..and Janelle Marshalle (team Australia) with Jackie Kane's (U.S.) pony Skye also prepping for Pony Worlds.

Here was our whirlwind schedule

8/25 Fly to Amsterdam

8/26-9/1 Train with Koos in Zwartewaal, Netherlands

9/1 Pickup Bruce Jones in Valkenswaard, Netherlands and drive to Lahden, Germany 9/4-7 Para World Championships

Did I mention that Bruce did all the driving and we drove on the autobahn...NO SPEED LIMIT!!!!!!!

The show in Lahden was also hosting the European 4-in-hand Championships..which Koos was competing at. This was fortunate because we had the whole de Ronde family + HUGE-and I mean HUGE-trailers to work off of..and Koos continued to work with me and Tjibbe to prepare for the show.

The venue was awesome and the weather was perfect. The Europeans are much more into carriage driving than in the U.S. There were 28 drivers competing from 9 countries in the para division as well as 44 in the 4-in-hand division.

This event was similar in some ways to the Olympics. There was entertainment..speeches..a parade of nations..and..a 'nations' night where each country set up a table with food/drink options indicative of their country. We served chili, red/white/blue M&M's and Jack Daniels with Coke. The chili was a hit-the Jack not so much

Thursday 9/4 was the dressage phase. One member of team USA..Tracy Bowman..won with her own Welsh pony. Tracy trains in Europe several months of the year. I managed to 'muddle' through with a less than stellar score.

We had Friday 9/5 off to check out the obstacles. They were challenging to be sure..but nothing I couldn't navigate with Bruce's expert help. I just want to add here that Bruce can look at an obstacle and see all the possibilities while my head is still trying to find 'A'. He was very patient with me and my 'old brain'.

Saturday 9/6 MARATHON DAY!

Bruce, Tjibbe and I were raring to go.

Sarah and family,Anna,Jackie and Janelle came to help out and cheer us on. Also..I forgot to mention..Abbie Trexler..ADS Executive Director and Teresa Bonny-Bon..ADS board

President..along with Steven Morrissey..USEF Director of Driving and...can't forget...MARCIE QUIST..our fearless Chef d'Equip...and Laura Werner..our team veterinarian.

The marathon was an EYE OPENER for me. It included an actual Section A. In my admittedly limited experience..the Section A's(warm up) in the U.S. consists of walking/trotting around in a controlled area for 25 minutes or so. This Section A was a 5K out and back 'course' with 2 control flags. It was a REAL timed workout.

Section B consisted of 6 obstacles. They were all challenging-it was a World Championships!but Bruce mapped out a course for me that appeared very doable. FULL COMPLETE HONEST

DISCLOSURE HERE. No excuses-just an explanation. I have been

driving a pony for the last 2 years. Max is a marathon machine. I freely admit that he makes me look good every day. Tjibbe is a much bigger marathon machine. My plan was to win marathon and show everyone how it's done. I hope it's ok to state this in print..I had my ass handed to me. I either turned too early in the obstacles..and..literally..got stuck and 'moved the furniture'. Ring crew..cleanup in obstacle 1. OR..I turned too late and missed the gate. Do I think any of this was funny?..NOPE..maybe in a couple of years. I think it will sting for a long time.

Somehow..God and Bruce helped me..I was not eliminated!

I finished 28th out of 28.

I AM HUMBLED

Cones competition on Sunday was a little less dramatic.

I had 3 balls down and time penalties on a very technical course.

Summation

scores from each team were thrown out..that would be my scores.

#### 3. From the announcement on 7/9 as a member of the team

until the actual competition 9/4-7 I had almost no team to fund raise. Many people stepped up to sponsor me. I AM SOOO GRATEFUL!!

We..the driving community..need to come together and find a way to help fund/ support not only the para drivers..but..also the pony and horse drivers with aspirations to compete at the World level. The World Championships are not likely to ever be held in the U.S. and shipping equines+carriages to Europe is a very expensive proposition.

Judy and I spent our last 2 days in Amsterdam at a real working windmill AirBnb. We Ubered into Amsterdam and enjoyed a relaxing/informative cruise on the canals.

It was the trip of a lifetime for me. I would love to have another chance to compete in 2 years.
