

Conditioning Your Horse

Dr. Lynn Dunn, recently retired Professor from the SUNY Cobleskill Animal Science Department, is an expert on the care and training of the equine athlete, equine exercise physiology and nutrition, and the care and training of the driving horse. For several hours on April 27th, she shared her knowledge and experience particular to the sport of distance driving/riding with CVCA members.



Dr. Dunn started the day with an overview of the principles of training that apply to horses being prepared for a competition, just being returned to work after a winter layoff, or those recovering from injury or illness. Some key points were to structure conditioning based on the animal's starting point and to make changes gradual and progressive. Conditioning programs should be based on the

individual horse (consider age, previous injury, mental state) and must include sufficient rest. Rest should be at least 1–2 days per week (maybe 3–4, depending on the horse) and need not be immobile rest. Rest can be a “active” as in an easy walk on level terrain.

Slow steady progression of increased demands helps to minimize injury and allows the equine athlete's body systems to adapt; different body systems adapt at different rates so be sure to allow time for the desired changes to occur over time. Cardio and muscles adapt most quickly, followed by ligaments, tendon, bones, and hooves. If competing, be sure to train in the same conditions that will prevail at the competition.





One way to assess your training program's success is to monitor the equine's recovery from work. Respiration, heart rate, heat tolerance, and hydration are all indicators of an equine's fitness and can be measured. Heart rate can be monitored by use of an equine heart rate monitor.

Dr. Dunn demonstrated the use of a heart rate monitor on my Haflinger Alex. Alex dutifully suited up in driving harness and I longed him as attendees monitored the change in his heart rate on Dr. Dunn's phone (there's an app for that!). Alex's heart rate increased from standing to walking to trotting and then decreased as he slowed his gaits. This is a very handy way to monitor your horse from the box seat! Dr. Dunn used a Polar device, but there are others from which to choose.

After the heart rate monitor demo, Dr. Dunn explained the sport of Distance Driving and Riding. This sport requires the equine to cover 15, 25, 40 or more miles within a defined timeframe while maintaining safe levels of respiration, heart rate, hydration, heat tolerance and other indicators of health. Distance events focus judgement on good, sound, steady and enthusiastic trail horses. The scoring system determines the best conditioned horse, not necessarily the best athlete. *(from the ECTRA website: <https://www.ectra.org/about-ectra/>)*

Horses start an event with 100 points and veterinarian checks are held before, during and after the event. At each check, horses are assessed and scored for body condition, overall skin and leg health, lameness, mechanical fatigue, metabolic fatigue, and behavior. Points are deducted for any deterioration in these areas from the start of the event.

Meet the Clinicians:

Sarah Reitz-Bates:

Sarah is a full-time competitor, trainer, instructor and clinician. Driving is her only business and her passion. Her results speak for themselves, in her domination of the East Coast Combined Driving event circuit, as well as her clients results in their personal competition or recreational driving endeavors. In 2023, she became the first and only driver to win both ADS and FEI Championships at the Intermediate level for Combined Driving in the same year.

Sarah has trained practically every breed of horse and pony. Her methods are solid and permanent. Her philosophy: bonding between horse and driver is essential to the safety and success of the driver and their animal. This is done with positive reinforcement to gain the animal's trust and respect. Sarah's training facility, High Hopes Farm is a "training hub" in Western NY. It is also the headquarters of High Hopes Carriage sales and horses and ponies for sale. She offers breeding of Welsh ponies and boarding. Several times a year at the farm, there are held clinics as well as driving competitions. Sarah, and High Hopes Farm is a virtual 1 stop shop for the carriage driving enthusiast.

Bruce Jones:

Bruce is the president of the Western New York Combined Carriage Association-WNYCCA. He is the force behind organizing/planning about 15 shows each year. Which, includes the popular ECHO series. The combination of Sarah and Bruce, with their driving knowledge and technical expertise, will help you get your driving game ready for the upcoming show season.



Clinic Information

The CVCA Cones and Obstacles clinic is for everyone who is interested in learning more about driving cones and obstacles, whether beginner or expert, or somewhere in between.

Clinic is limited to a maximum of 12 turnouts.

All participants will be involved in morning and afternoon sessions both days.

Helmets are required for all drivers and passengers. No exceptions.

Drivers should carry whip in hand. Wearing of gloves is strongly recommended.

All drivers may bring a groom at no additional charge.

Auditors are welcome. Please pre-register.

Hot and cold beverages, snacks and lunch will be provided for clinic participants, grooms and auditors both days.

Coffee and pastries both days.

Current, (2024) CVCA members will be given priority, if registered by May 1st.

Clinic cost is \$250, which includes day and overnight stabling and lunch for both days. A discount will be given for early registration (see registration form).

Overnight stabling is available for both Friday and Saturday night. Driver must provide own bedding and must clean their stall(s) prior to departure on Sunday.

Rough camping (no hook-ups) at Sheffield Farm is available for both Friday and Saturday nights upon request. There is a restroom on the farm.

Drivers are encouraged to bring their equines and equipment Friday night and unload and set up for the weekend. This will ensure a prompt start for the clinic at 9am the next morning. We encourage everyone to come to Sheffield Farm

for a fun weekend of learning and comradery in the sport of carriage driving!




