Oremus: Cycle of Prayer 2020 - 2021

It has been suggested over the past few years that the Traditional Anglican Church have a Cycle of Prayer Intentions, which the Provinces, Dioceses, Parishes and individual clergy and laity may use to lift each other up to God through Christ in prayer. To this end, I have prepared the following Oremus for 2021-2022, beginning on Advent Sunday, November 28, 2021.

This list of prayer intentions is optional and offered only as a guide. These may be incorporated into the Biddings and Intercessions, incorporating a cycle of prayer each Sunday for the global Traditional Anglican Church, the national church or diocese, and the local parish. These intentions may also be incorporated into the offices of Morning Prayer (Matins) and Evening Prayer (Evensong), if desired, either by remembering the intention for Sunday throughout the week, or by cycling through the entries according to local custom.

Advent Sunday: November 28, 2021

For the Catholic faith, orthodox worship, apostolic order, and evangelical witness of the Traditional Anglican Church around the world. In particular, for the Primate: Archbishop Shane Janzen; the Secretary of the College of Bishops: Archbishop Michael Gill; and all the Bishops of the College of Bishops.

Advent 2: December 5, 2021

For the Anglican Catholic Church in Australia; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop David Robarts; the Clergy and People.

Advent 3: December 12, 2021

For the Anglican Catholic Church of Canada – Diocese of Canada West; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Archbishop Shane Janzen; the Clergy and People.

Advent 4: December 19, 2021

For the Anglican Catholic Church of Canada – Diocese of Canada East; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop Craig Botterill; the Clergy and People.

Christmas Day: December 25, 2021

For Christians throughout the world celebrating the Nativity of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world: That we may faithfully witness to the love and saving grace of our Redeemer.

Sunday After Christmas Day (Feast of St. Stephen the Proto-Martyr): December 26, 2021

For Christians throughout the world celebrating the Nativity of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the world: That we may go forth in the name of Christ the Redeemer to evangelize our community and world.

Christmas 2: January 2, 2022

For peace and good will among all peoples; and in prayer that God may pardon our transgressions of the past and bless to us the new year.

The Epiphany of Our Lord: January 6, 2022

For the spread of the Gospel around the world; in particular, for Christian missionaries at home and abroad: That we may bring Christ to the nations and the nations to Christ.

Epiphany 1: January 9, 2022

For the Anglican Church in America – Diocese of the Northeast; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop Brian Marsh; the Bishop Coadjutor, Bishop Andy Webb; for Bishop George Langberg, retired; the Clergy and People.

Epiphany 2: January 16, 2022

For the Anglican Church in America – Diocese of the Eastern United States; in particular, for the Clergy and People.

Epiphany 3: January 23, 2022

For the Anglican Church in America – Diocese of the Missouri Valley; in particular, for the Clergy and People.

Epiphany 4: January 30, 2022

For the Anglican Church in America – Diocese of the West; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop Owen Williams; his Suffragan, Bishop William Bower; the Clergy and People.

Epiphany 5: February 6, 2022

For the Anglican Church in America – Diocese of Puerto Rico and The Caribbean; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop Juan Garcia; the Clergy and People.

Septuagesima: February 13, 2022

For the Anglican Church of India; in particular, for their Metropolitan, Archbishop Samuel Prakash; Bishop-elect John Ashish Prakash (Diocese of Nagpur) and Bishop-elect Sunil Kumar (Diocese of Amritsar); the Clergy and People.

Sexagesima: February 20, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Latin America; in particular, for their Presiding Bishop and Ordinary, Bishop Ruben Rodriguez, the Clergy and People.

Quinquagesima: February 27, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Latin America – Western Region of Guatemala; in particular, for their Suffragan Bishop, Bishop Juan Sión Lobos, the Clergy and People.

Lent 1: March 6, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Latin America – District Region of Salvador; in particular, for their Suffragan Bishop, Bishop Santos Garcia Tista, the Clergy and People.

Lent 2: March 13, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Southern Africa; in particular, for their Metropolitan and Bishop Ordinary, Archbishop Michael Gill; Bishop-elect Augustine Koluti; the Clergy and People.

Lent 3: March 20, 2022

For the Continuing Anglican Church in Zambia; in particular, for the Clergy and People.

Lent 4: March 27, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Southern Africa (Zimbabwe); in particular, for Bishop Wellington Murinda (Suffragan Bishop), the Clergy and People.

Lent 5 – Passion Sunday: April 3, 2022

For the Church of Ireland (Traditional Rite); in particular, the Clergy and People.

For the retired Bishops, Priests, Deacons, and Lay Readers across the Traditional Anglican Church; and in thanksgiving for their faithful witness and service to Christ and His Church.

Palm Sunday: April 10, 2022

For the Traditional Anglican Church in Britain; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary, Bishop Ian Gray, the Clergy and People.

The Persecuted Church throughout the world, for Christians suffering for the Faith of Christ, and for the overcoming of hatred, prejudice and injustice in the world.

Easter Day: April 17, 2022

For our fellow Christians throughout the world celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. For all who are lost that they may seek and find Him who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

Octave Day of Easter (Easter 1): April 24, 2022

For those grieving the loss of a loved one, and for all who are uncertain of their salvation: That the Lord of Life and Victor over death may be their consolation and blessed assurance.

Feast of St. Philip and St. James the Apostles (Easter 2): May 1, 2022

For the growth, witness and unity of the traditional Anglican expression of the Christian Faith around the world through the leadership and outreach of the Traditional Anglican Church.

Easter 3: May 8, 2022

For the work and ministry of the International Anglican Fellowship; in particular, for the Board of Directors; Executive Director, Father Ed Ihde; and the Stewards and volunteers across the Traditional Anglican Church.

Easter 4: May 15, 2022

For traditional Anglican theological colleges and seminaries around the world; in particular, for Saint Bede's Anglican Catholic Theological College: That the true faith and orthodox worship of God in the Anglican tradition may be taught and fostered throughout the Traditional Anglican Church.

Easter 5: May 22, 2022

For the retired Bishops, Priests, Deacons, and Lay Readers across the Traditional Anglican Church; and in thanksgiving for their faithful witness and service to Christ and His Church.

For farmers and fishermen, that God may bless their labour that in due season we may enjoy the bounty of land and sea.

Sunday After Ascension Day: May 29, 2022

For Saint Mary's Church, Caracas, Venezuela: for their Episcopal Visitor, Bishop Juan Garcia; the Clergy, Church Wardens and People.

Whitsunday – The Day of Pentecost: June 5, 2022

For the unity of all Christian Churches and denominations: That through the power of the Holy Spirit there may be one Faith, One Church, One God and Father of all.

Trinity Sunday: June 12, 2022

For the work and witness of the Christian Religion, that all peoples and nations may come to the knowledge of the true faith in God the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Trinity 1: June 19, 2022

Trinity 2: June 26, 2022

In particular, for the Primate: Archbishop Shane Janzen; the Secretary of the College of Bishops: Archbishop Michael Gill; and all the Bishops of the College of Bishops.

Trinity 3: July 3, 2022

For the Anglican Catholic Church in Australia; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop David Robarts; the Clergy and People.

Trinity 4: July 10, 2022

For the Anglican Catholic Church of Canada – Diocese of Canada West; in particular, for their Metropolitan and Bishop Ordinary: Archbishop Shane Janzen; the Clergy and People.

Trinity 5: July 17, 2022

For the Anglican Catholic Church of Canada – Diocese of Canada East; in particular, for their Bishop Ordinary: Bishop Craig Botterill; the Clergy and People.

Trinity 6: July 24, 2022

Trinity 12: September 4, 2022

Trinity 13: September 11, 2022

Trinity 14: September 18, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Latin America – District Region of Salvador; in particular, for their Suffragan Bishop: Bishop Santos Garcia Tista, the Clergy and People.

Trinity 15: September 25, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Southern Africa; in particular, for their Metropolitan and Bishop Ordinary, Archbishop Michael Gill; Bishop-elect Augustine Koliti; the Clergy and People.

Trinity 16: October 2, 2022

For traditional Anglican theological colleges and seminaries around the world; in particular, for Saint Bede’s Anglican Catholic Theological College: That the true faith and orthodox worship of God in the Anglican tradition may be taught and fostered throughout the Traditional Anglican Church.

Trinity 17: October 9, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Southern Africa – Diocese of Zambia; in particular, for the Clergy and People.

Trinity 18: October 16, 2022

For the growth, witness and unity of the traditional Anglican expression of the Christian Faith around the world through the leadership and outreach of the Traditional Anglican Church.

Trinity 19: October 23, 2022

For the Anglican Church in Southern Africa (Zimbabwe); in particular, for Bishop Wellington Murinda (Suffragan Bishop), the Clergy and People.

For the unity of the Continuing Anglican church jurisdictions around the world: That together we may effectively and faithfully witness to the historic Anglican expression of the Christian Faith.

Trinity 20: October 30, 2022

For the Bishops, Clergy, and People of the Traditional Anglican Church who have faithfully witnessed to Christ, and have gone before us marked with the sign of faith: That they may rest in peace and rise in glory!

Trinity 21: November 6, 2022

For all who labour for peace and righteousness among the nations, that the day may be hastened when war shall be no more.

Trinity 22: November 13, 2022

For the work and ministry of the International Anglican Fellowship; in particular, for the Board of Directors; Executive Director, Father Ed Ihde; and the Stewards across the Traditional Anglican Church.

The Sunday Next Before Advent: November 20, 2022

For the coming again in glory of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; and in prayer that all nations, governments and peoples may acknowledge the sovereignty of the Lord Jesus Christ as the only King of kings and Lord of lords, to the glory of God the Father.
