




## **WAYS YOU AND THE COMMUNITY CAN ASSIST:**

- Provide Habitat by planting rather than clearing trees.
- Think of the native Animals before you clear or build.
- Plant food trees.
- Preserve wildlife corridors which provide connectivity for the mating season.
- Become a wires helper.
- Support Awareness programs and films when screened as hosted by WVRA Inc. December 2025 (as above).
- Drive slowly (abide by the new flash sign speed) as you enter Woronora Valley and drive along Heathcote Road with awareness.
- Support underground passes for escape in fires.
- Keep dogs and pets on leashes.

- Important: Do not try to handle or move the koala yourself; stay a safe distance away and wait for trained rescuers.
