All schools are expected to provide opportunities for the spiritual, moral, social and cultural (SMSC) development of their pupils.

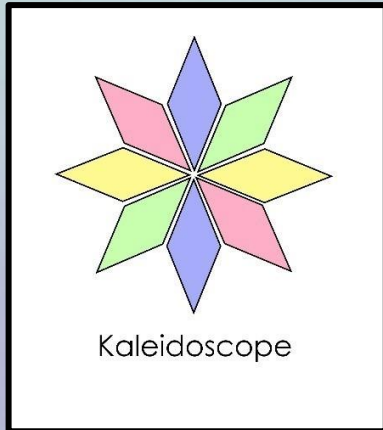
As part of this, you should promote “fundamental British values”. The DfE define these values as:

Mutual respect for and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs



At Kaleidoscope School:

In Kaleidoscope School children are exposed to the fundamental British Values on a daily basis. Learners are encouraged to work on relationships and respect as part of the RSE curriculum.

Learners are familiar with the Rule of Law and lessons are tailored to ensure that the pupils understand the concept at their own individual learning levels.

Tolerance is taught throughout the curriculum and peoples differences are embraced and celebrated. Learners are encouraged to ask questions about differing beliefs, families and traditions.

Learners are actively encouraged to make a difference to school life as well as the wider community through links with local nurseries and community groups. Children show pride in their local area by offering to organise litter picks!
