



Commissioner's Corner

Charlotte County Veterans Clinic

Several years ago the Veterans Administration agreed to expanding our Charlotte County VA Clinic to 32,000 square feet. They even suggested it would be somewhere between Kings Highway and Tamiami Trail (41) as it goes through Charlotte County.

We were told the VA was waiting for the funds to be appropriated. Not hearing a word for several years, we were all surprised by a press release this past January indicating that the clinic was going to be expanded. But it was going to be located in North port, and our clinic would be closed! North Port has a population of about 90,000 people — Charlotte County has a population of 224,000 people and an estimated veteran population of over 35,000.

This is not acceptable! We have many veterans who rely on Charlotte Transit to get back and forth from the clinic. Charlotte Transit cannot leave out county. Sarasota County has a clinic. Lee County has a Clinic. We must maintain our Charlotte County clinic. I contacted our Congressional Delegation to seek their support. We formed an ad hoc committee including Punta Gorda Mayor, Dr. Deborah Lux, Air Force Veteran and Kathleen "Kat" Pellegrino and held a Zoom conference

call with Congressman Steube's office last week. The Congressman had not been advised of the proposed move and he was also very concerned. The VA Secretary told him after a few calls that our clinic would stay in Charlotte County. I suggested he get it in writing.

We are still looking to get this confirmed and our facility enlarged to include some additional services like vision checks and hearing tests. We are having a second meeting with the Congressman next week and we will keep everyone posted.

Memorial Day Remembrance

Over the years, Memorial Day has become better known as the unofficial start of the summer season. All too many folks limit their celebrating the day off with hot dogs and barbeques, forgetting the real meaning of the day.

Memorial Day is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. Originally known as "Decoration Day", the graves of soldiers were decorated with flowers and visited with respectful mourning. Many wore a red poppy in honor of those who made the supreme sacrifice to preserve our nation's freedom.

The history of Memorial Day goes back to the post-civil war era when some women in a small southern town in the south were placing flowers on the graves of their fallen fathers, husbands and sons. One of the women noticed her friend placing flowers on the graves of Union soldier, she asked the woman why she was decorating the grave of a Union solder. The woman responded and said she had some flowers left and she was sure that there are women in the north placing flowers on the graves of the Confederate soldiers we all loved and cherished.

The day was officially proclaimed on May 5, 1868, by General John Logan, Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic. It was observed on May 30, 1868, as Decoration Day, with the placing of flowers on graves in

memory and appreciation of both Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery.

Today Memorial Day honors all Americans who have died in all of our wars. It is a day we remember those who died serving in the United States Armed Forces. Decorating graves may not be, but the importance of remembering those who have given their lives for our freedom is stronger today than ever.

This Memorial Day weekend, some 1,200 soldiers of the 3rd U.S. Infantry will place a small American flag at each one of the more than 400,000 graves Arlington National Cemetery and then they will patrol the area 24 hours per day all weekend to ensure that each and every flag remains flying.

We invite you join us on May 26, and carry on these traditions, in true remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. On Monday May 26th at 10:00 am Charlotte County will have our annual Memorial Day program at the Replica of the Vietnam Wall in Punta Gorda. This is our effort to regain the true spirit of Memorial Day, and to remind us all to continue to honor those who have lost their lives for freedom.

We should encourage each other to visit cemeteries and place flags and flowers on soldier's graves, to visit memorials and reflect with our neighbors, to fly the U.S. Flag at half-staff until noon, to always fly the

POW/MIA flag to remember, and to honor those who have paid the ultimate price for our freedoms.

Charlotte County Board of County Commissioners Combat Wounded Veteran Recognition Program

<u>Purpose:</u> To recognize those individuals who, in the defense of their Country sustained injuries from combat and were awarded the Purple Heart.

Note: The Purple Heart is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to any member of the Armed Forces of the United States who, while serving under competent authority in any capacity with one of the U.S. Armed Services after April 5, 1917, has been wounded or killed.

<u>Criteria:</u> Veteran must have served during a War Time Period as set forth by the Laws of the United States and must have received the Purple Heart for injuries sustained. Veteran MUST be considered a full time Charlotte County resident. A DD214 or equivalent discharge form (WWII/ some Korean War veterans) will be required along with application. If the Purple Heart medal is not on the discharge, proper documentation showing the award after-the-fact must be provided.

<u>Nomination Process:</u> All nomination request forms must be turned in to the Charlotte County Veteran Services Office (1050 Loveland Blvd, Port Charlotte) by the 4th Monday of the month for a vote by the Charlotte County Veterans Council (CCVC). Nomination forms that are submitted late will not be reviewed until the next month.

<u>Selection Process</u>: The Charlotte County Veterans Council Executive Board will select the top three candidates and request a vote at the General Membership Meeting on the 4th Saturday of each month. The candidate receiving the most votes will have his/her nomination form forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners. The veteran will be notified of the date, time, and place of this honor.
