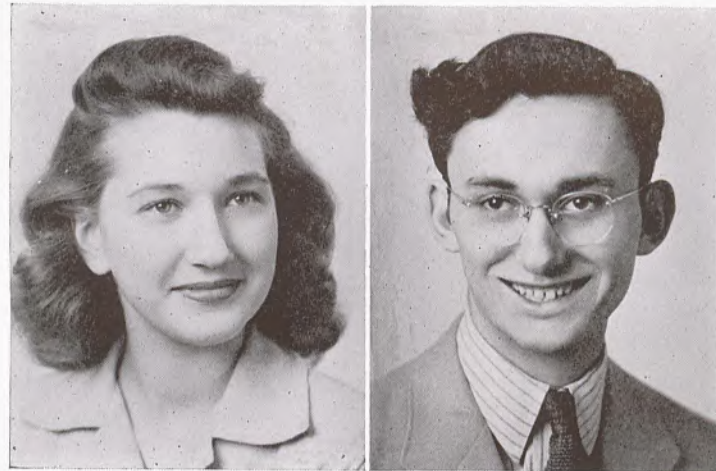
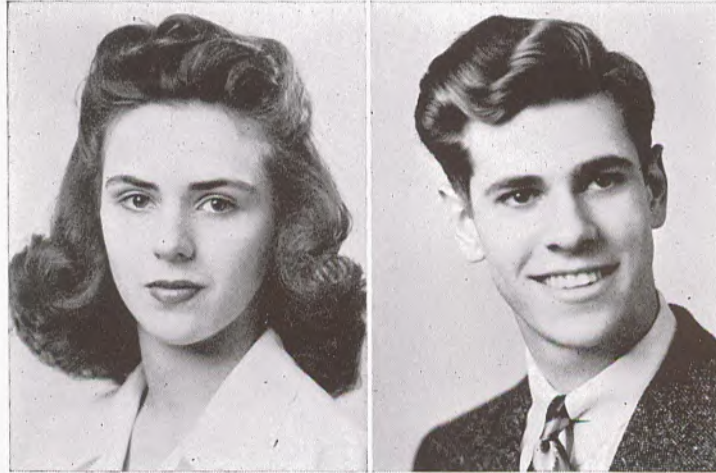
OLIVER HOFFMAN

CLASS HISTORY

Leading the field in the ninth grade Girls' Track Team were Dorothy Kapsar, Carol Romweber and Margaret Mary McIntyre.

Although having a classy track team, Mr. Holden's boys managed to finish only fifth in the West Tech relays.

There were 341 of us as we became 10B's.

Jack Held organized a debating team and presided as student chairman.

Gwen Morris and Dale Tengler received glory when they had their personalities written up in the *Review*.

Gloria Witthuhn strutted as majorette across the gridiron every weekend. Cheerleaders Valentine and Hancy led the cheers.

Upholding the scholastic ability of our class was Dorothy Niedhammer, as she qualified for the Honor Roll alone.

With "Big Bill" Bruggemeier breaking into the opponent's forward wall, "our side" started West Tech on a long life of defeats, 12 - 6, and broke Parma's twelve game winning streak 13 - 6.

As we became 10A's most of us were deeply moved by the death of Mr. Booth.

Marge Hrack posed a pretty pose for the *Review* front page during Latin Club initiation.

Most of the girls volunteered to help with sugar rationing while the boys enjoyed their afternoons off.

Not many of us were part of the Spring production, "Through the Night," but we all enjoyed it.

Elected Track Queen, Gwen Morris reigned at the North Eastern Ohio District Meet.

Several Rhodians had a chance to test their throwing arms on the Cleveland Indians' pitching meter.

In order to make a clean sweep of it Rhodes beat West Tech on the hardwood 43 - 37.

With Lowell Shiray breaking into the sports news our "runners" outran all opponents to win the first annual Rhodes Relays, finishing five points ahead of Lincoln. We placed fourth in the West Tech relays, one place higher than in the preceding year.

As Juniors we sat at the Holy Name football game as Cheerleader Duane Cassidy opened up with "Hello Ignatius!"

Compulsory gym classes were now being offered for all boys fit or unfit.

Marion Sandrock, as social chairman, helped make the Charity Kickoff Dance a success.

The Honor Roll now held the names of Kopp, Ptak, A. Schmidt, and Kleinpell.

Because of the male shortage a Christmas play was prevented but the choir did honors with Winarski, Wittuhn, Morris, Kramer, Kopcok, Kish, Kapsar, Blouch, Paxson, Oiler, Svendsen, Bruggemeier, Goltz, Shiray, Weber, and Struhar as vocalists.

Denied a place in the charity game because of two tie games, we still had the crowned glory of having an undefeated football team.

From the wrestling mats came the cry that three boys were practically tearing their opponents apart. This was easily explained for they were none other than Bill Rossoll, "Chuck" Kuehn, and John Weber.

A young man by the name of Eugene Schmidt started to distinguish himself by his exhibits in football and basketball.

The *Review* staff took on Bird, Beyer, Stahl, Rossoll, Tengler, Yesny, Paxson, and Lembke as we became 11A's.

Palsha ruled as President with Arnold, Magee, and Schroeder as vice-president, secretary and treasurer respectively.

The Senior girls challenged the junior girls to a contest to see who were superior bond salesmen. We won, and proceeds were used to buy a jeep.

"Bookies" of the class, Arnold, Schuller, Kleinpell, Keppler, Darmstadt, Sandrock, Back, Ptak, A. Schmidt, Radway, Kozminski, and Roth made the Honor Society at their first try.

Ann Marie Magee stepped up as Student Council secretary.

Dutch treats were discussed in the *Review* by Pack, Loomis, and Holley.

Running as candidates for Miss Victory were Lucille Evans and Eleanore Straub. Eleanore came out as attendant.

Soloist Elaine Kopcok shone brightly in "Uncle Sam Serenades."

We aren't certain if it was the prodigious amount of cut-slips and tardinesses that drove Mr. Bryan away, but he left and Mr. Effron took over.

In the cinder path Milling, Poremba, Schroeder, Darmstadt, and Foran found their places to give very creditable performances.

Our 11A class picnic was held amid rain and mud at Snow Road Metropolitan Park where a good time was had by all.

Bidding our many homeroom teachers adieu as "senioritis" began to creep up on us we were put into two homerooms. The girls under Thompson and Palmer, the boys, ruled by Tanko and Ferguson.

Arnold presided as 12B President; Schroeder as vice-president awaited the day he could take over. Evans wrote the minutes and we trusted Shiray with our money.

Wildman and Lempke were associate editors of the *Review*. Yesny was made Business Manager.

With the departure of Dave Schuller, Bill Bruggemeier took over as Student Council vice-president.

Jack Preston Held was a speaker for our first town meeting. Winn, Dieterich and Cassidy kept the ball rolling with their questions.

Bill Blonchek squeezed his accordion at the rally to "beat Lincoln," preceeding the game of the season.

S.K.F. pervaded the school.

Although the Boosters' Club was disbanded, the Delta Hi-Y contributed a ram to the school as a mascot.

Even though it received able support from Harris, Foran, Hubay, Svendsen and others already mentioned the football team did not quite measure up to pre-season standards.

Lucille Evans copped the crown of season football queen.

Brainstorms Kopcok, Korsgaard, Kosar, Jaros, and Magee made the Honor Society.

The basketball team had its "usual" season with Schmidt and Seymour finishing up their careers.

As we reached the final rung in our climb up the ladder, Ann Marie Magee made history as she was elected senior class President, being only the second girl president in the history of the school. Lester Arnold was vice-president, Jeanette Winarski, Secretary, and Rudy Korsgaard, treasurer. Helen Zidek took over the social activities of the class.

Because of the many 12B's eager to finish school early, Miss Adams was made ruler of another girls' homeroom.

Lembke finally became editor-in-chief of the R. R.

Taking a last try for honor society membership Bruggemeier, Blonchek, Maline, Morris, Straub, and Root came out on top.

The 12B-12A afternoon party was the usual success with the boys' stag line on one side of the gymnasium, the girls' on the other.

The all musical "A Song in My Heart" featured Kopcok and Dieterich as soloists with an enormous cast of Mixed voices.

Leaving us, to join the armed forces before they had the opportunity of graduating, were Ray Neff, John Porto, Ted Andrus, Ray Hancy, Wally Widowski, Rob Metz, Leonard Kail, and Norman Hanousek.

It took four years of hard practice, but Rudy Korsgaard finally came into the limelight on the relay team.

Gilbert DeMattie won the ping-pong tournament with Retzloff as runner-up.

As the last few months of our high-school career rolled around, the boys exhibited many a Tarzanic physique and a few sore muscles, as a result of the Military Prep. classes. Girls searched madly for informal and formal dates, but all was well as 215 of us, as men and women of the world, graduated at the Masonic Temple on June 6, 1944, leaving only pleasant memories behind.
