## CLASS HISTORY

DEAR DIARY,

SEPTEMBER 9, 1944: We'll never forget this day as long as we live. We were excited, confused, eager, and a little frightened all at once. We wondered very much what the next four years would hold for us. From being "tops" at Benjie, Harper, and Good Counsel, here we were the very lowest a Rhodian can be, with the horrible word "flat" tacked to us. Today we saw the principals, Mr. Mathews, Miss Hier, and Mr. Effron. We also saw a crew of teachers, hoards of strange faces, millions of green monsters called lockers. Some silly seniors thought we could be fooled by that old gag about elevator passes but we weren't. Tonight we went home and dreamed about numbers and program cards and swimming pools on the roof and numbers and fee tickets and numbers.

SEPTEMBER 23, 1944. Those darn upperclassmen have been sending us everywhere but the right place. The hardest thing to find is the shop corridor!

SEPTEMBER 26, 1944: This afternoon was the freshman party in the gym. Some seniors helped the livewire gym teacher, Mr. Seedhouse, feed us on pop and pretzels. We played musical chairs and raced around in a lively game of black and white.

SEPTEMBER 28, 1944: We elected 9B Student Council representatives today. This is the first time any of us "flats" will have a voice in the school. Those elected were Luella Syroski, Ruth Imhof, Elva Rogers, Ed Carter, Ralph Schmotzer, Steve Mahoney, and Mike Kraynak.

SEPTEMBER 30, 1944: One month of being a flat is gone! We know now that the auditorium is on the big right wing, the cafeteria is on the second floor and the gym right beneath it. We even know enough not to triapse through the inner offices!

OCTOBER 3, 1944: Today we had a nice football rally in the auditorium. Joel Bahner made his debut in the abbreviated garb of Cupid!

OCTOBER 14, 1944: Coach Holden held the Discovery Day track meet today. Dan Katt, Harvey Richardson, Gordon Hunter, Jim Lilly, and Skip Pierie showed up well.

OCTOBER 20, 1944: In Orientation classes we have been urged to join as many clubs as possible. A lot aren't open to us but we are joining those that are: Leora Dandoy, Arlene Tischler, and Ralph Wolff joined the orchestra with Ralph Schmotzer and Gordon Muthersbaugh in the band. Some of us work on the Junior Journal and some sing in the choruses. Many girls have joined the Junior Friendship Club.

OCTOBER 31, 1944: Tonight was the "First Annual Kick-Off" and our first school dance. The girls wore skirts and sweaters and loafer, and the boys wore sport suits. We danced to "I'll Be Seeing You" and clapped to "Deep In The Heart Of Texas."

NOVEMBER 15, 1944: We're suffering through the rigors of x times y, the Neolithic Man, Cleveland's laws, T-Squares, and "amo-amis-amat" in our classes now.

FEBRUARY 1, 1945: We're 9A's. Now we can have at least a few people to look down upon.

FEBRUARY 4, 1945: Our class promises great things in the sports future. Putich, Bahner, and Kraynak are freshman cagers to watch. Our own Ed Carter skated his way to win honors in almost every Northeastern ice contest.

MARCH 20, 1945: We're spending a lot of our juke box nickels for War Stamps. They may call us "bobby-soxers" but here at Rhodes we put the Sixth War Loan Drive over the top. We're humming "One Meatball" now which is about as close to meat as we get these days.

APRIL 1, 1945: These days we're struggling through Scott's "Ivanhoe," and since we're all victims of spring fever it makes it doubly hard.

APRIL 4, 1945: When we got our Junior Journal today we saw that a P-51 Mustang bought by our dimes is flying over Germany. Also, we saw that in a poll, Van Johnson is the favorite pin-up boy.

APRIL 9, 1945: This was National Hobo Week. We celebrated by wearing jeans and saddle shoes at least one day this week.

MAY 7, 1945: Nazis Quit! This bold-face headline which we had all been hoping for, became a reality today . . . V-E Day it was called.

MAY 12, 1945: Standard's is the standard hangout for most of Rhodes and we are no exception. We go there in cotton dresses, saddle shoes, and tee shirts and slacks.

MAY 30, 1945: Jack Ferguson, Gordon Hunter, and Myron Walzak were initiated into the Latin Club. They are the only ones to be admitted to a language club this year.

JUNE 8, 1945: We saw our first spring play, "Sky Roads." In school, the girls in the clothing classes are rushing to finish their skirts before school closes. The track season has come to a close. We daydream through our last freshman days.

SEPTEMBER 12, 1945: Back to school as sophomores and much had changed. During the summer the Japanese had surrendered and the bombing of Hiroshima has launched us on the atomic age. The casualty lists decreased and our interest turned to the returning vets. In our class, Chuck Copp returned from the Army and joined up. Capt. Clyde Henderson has returned to teach chemistry. The girls' gym teacher, Miss Thompson, came back as Mrs. Neff. Mr. Bryan is the new assistant principal in Mr. Effrons place.

SEPTEMBER 15, 1945: Mike Kraynak, Ruth Eberling, Dorothy Theodore, Elva Rogers, and Irene Martin are the new Review members from our class. Our boys are joining the Rhoda-, Sigma-, and Alpha-, Hi-Ys thick and fast. Most of the girls have joined the Senior Friendship Club.

SEPTEMBER 26, 1945: The long-awaited mirrors appeared in the washrooms today.

OCTOBER 17, 1945: Rhoda Hamilton, Mary Scharrella, Dick Velotta, and Parm Ellsasser were the first of us to become French Club members and Don Paul and Ralph Schmotzer are doing the honors in the German Club.
