## IN MEMORIAM

It was the fond dream of the committee that they could live up to this goal and have Miss Barhyte witness it. It is certain that everyone who ever knew her recognized her as a fine woman and a worthy citizen and will remember her as such.

The boys proved that they too had athletic ability when the Frosh football squad finished a fairly successful season with ROCCO and KURTZ leading the scoring. The opening of the basketball season found DON NEUMAN, TONY ROCCO, and FRANK GUZIK as promising hardwooders. In track, DON NEUMAN set a new Freshman low-hurdle record.

The time had finally come when we were no longer lowly Frosh but now were Sophomores. Our interests were widening and we began to participate in extra-curricular activities such as FTA Club, German Club, Girls' and Boys' Leaders Clubs, Glee Club, and Jr. Choir. "Change of Pace," a student written musical show, gave us a chance to display our various talents. FRANK CRISAFI made his vocal debut when he sang a solo in this unusual production. All in all, this was a very prosperous semester for our class. We were already beginning to establish ourselves as a class with a lot of spirit, for both the class and the school.

FRANK GUZIK again appeared in the athletic limelight when he was chosen for the All-Scholastic Football Team. We had a treat when the worst blizzard of the century extended our Thanksgiving Holiday one week. But, unfortunately, it shortened our Christmas Vacation. Harbor Lights was the theme of our 11A Class Informal, held on January 18. Again our class showed its wonderful spirit by its nearly 100 per cent attendance. What a marvelous class!!

Our Senior Year started off with a bang, for the boys especially, with the organization of the "Bird Man's Army." The sound of cadence could be heard throughout the school as the boys were put through their paces. The threat of atomic attack brought the need for Security Drills into being for the girls as well as the boys. This semester, the National Honor Society inducted into membership ARLENE ASHMEYER, JANET KLEIN, JUNE TUSSEY, RAY LEONARD, and JACK PAULOSKI. We elected RON TYMINSKI to head our class and, also, JAN'CE ALLSHOUSE, Vice-President; JUNE TUSSEY, Secretary; FRANK CRISAFI, Treasurer; and VERA SEBOK, Social Chairman. Our excellent basketball squad ended the season in second place and thus was eligible for the play-off game at the Arena. We played Latin, losing a hard game by a score of 52-51. On May 9, our 12B Informal, Blossom Time, was held. We all had a wonderful time dancing, singing, and, of course, eatinл. At the Awards Assembly, DIANE McKIRAHAN was awarded the Latin Certificate and WANDA NOWAK and ELINOR MATYSIAK received Gregg Shorthand Pins. May 23 was the day of our class picnic. It was a beautiful day and, again, almost everyone came. Another semester came to an end. It was hard to realize that in less than a year we would leave our school years behind us.

In July, BETTY HASSON represented our class in the "Miss Brooklyn" popularity contest. She was victorious and won a trip to Washington, D. C.

Over the span of three and one-half years, our class lost thirty-nine members. Since we were now 12A's, the remaining eighty members merged into one happy homeroom. Early in this new semester, we had our first class meeting at which we elected class officers. DON NEUMAN was elected President; RON TYMINSKI, Vice-President; ELAINE KALILICH, Secretary; and FRANK CRISAFI, Treasurer. These officers, together with Mrs. Cwik and Mr. Tanko, chose chairmen for the various committees. VERA SEBOK was given the job of Social Chairman and RAY LEONARD, Yearbook Chairman. With our officers chosen, we proceeded to plan this eventful last semester. The day of our class picnic, October 10, was as appropriate a day as conceivable. As usual, our class cooperated whole-heartedly. We all played football and baseball. Then the main attraction, food, led us to the pavilion where we later danced and sang. FRANK GUZIK and LOUIS SCHENK captained our hardy football team to a victorious finish as West Senate Champs. TONY ROCCO led the West Senate scoring for the season, helping our team to its first untied and undefeated season. BETTY HASSON was elected Football Queen and ELAINE KALILICH was her attendant. These girls reigned at the Charity Game, where we fought Collinwood, and won by a score of 21 to 14. November 17 was another big event for us, as our Informal, Starlight Fantasy, brought us a night we all shall long remember. We danced to soft music under a blue sky twinkling with hundreds of glittering stars. Happiness seemed to prevail, but suddenly the gaiety vanished. Our Miss Barhyte passed away. She had served us in every way possible, as a teacher and as a friend.

Yet to come are our Prom-Moonlinght and Roses, and Class Day. We know that these days will be wonderful. For, if our class continues to cooperate as it has in the past, there will be no doubt of the success of everything we attempt. Our class has made a place for itself in every phase of school life: Musically, Scholastically, Athletically, and in service and leadership. On Commencement Night, we will arise on a new step in our lives. The future that lies ahead will be new and different for us. It will be a challenge. But we have met challenges before and have overcome obstacles seemingly unsurmountable. Life is what one makes it and we must all remember:
"This above all-to thine own self be true; And it must follow, as the night the day, Thou canst not then be false to any man."
