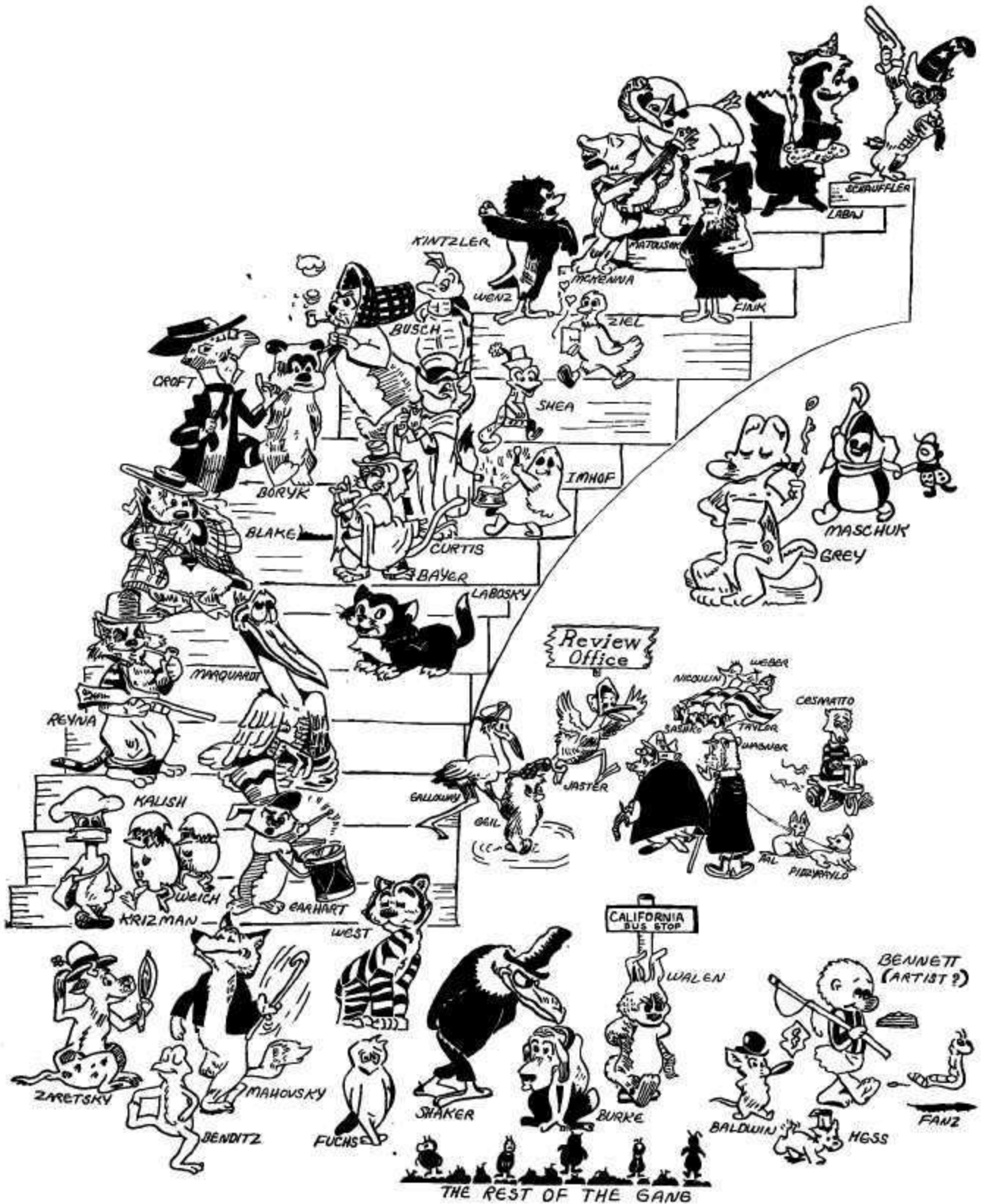

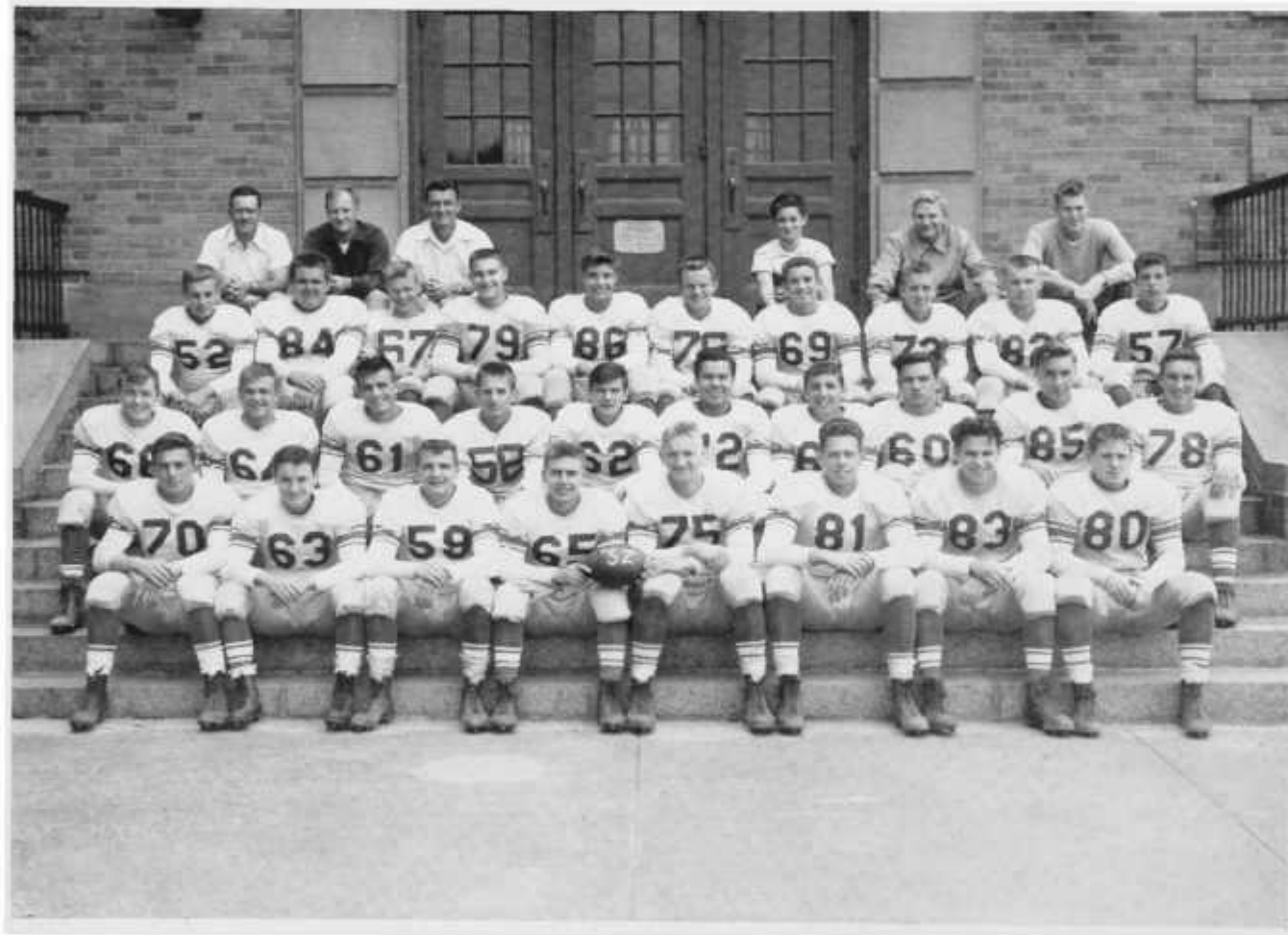

Dungeon 200 sports one more lucky member with Eter O'Vich being the first of us to win her 140 Shorthand Speed award.

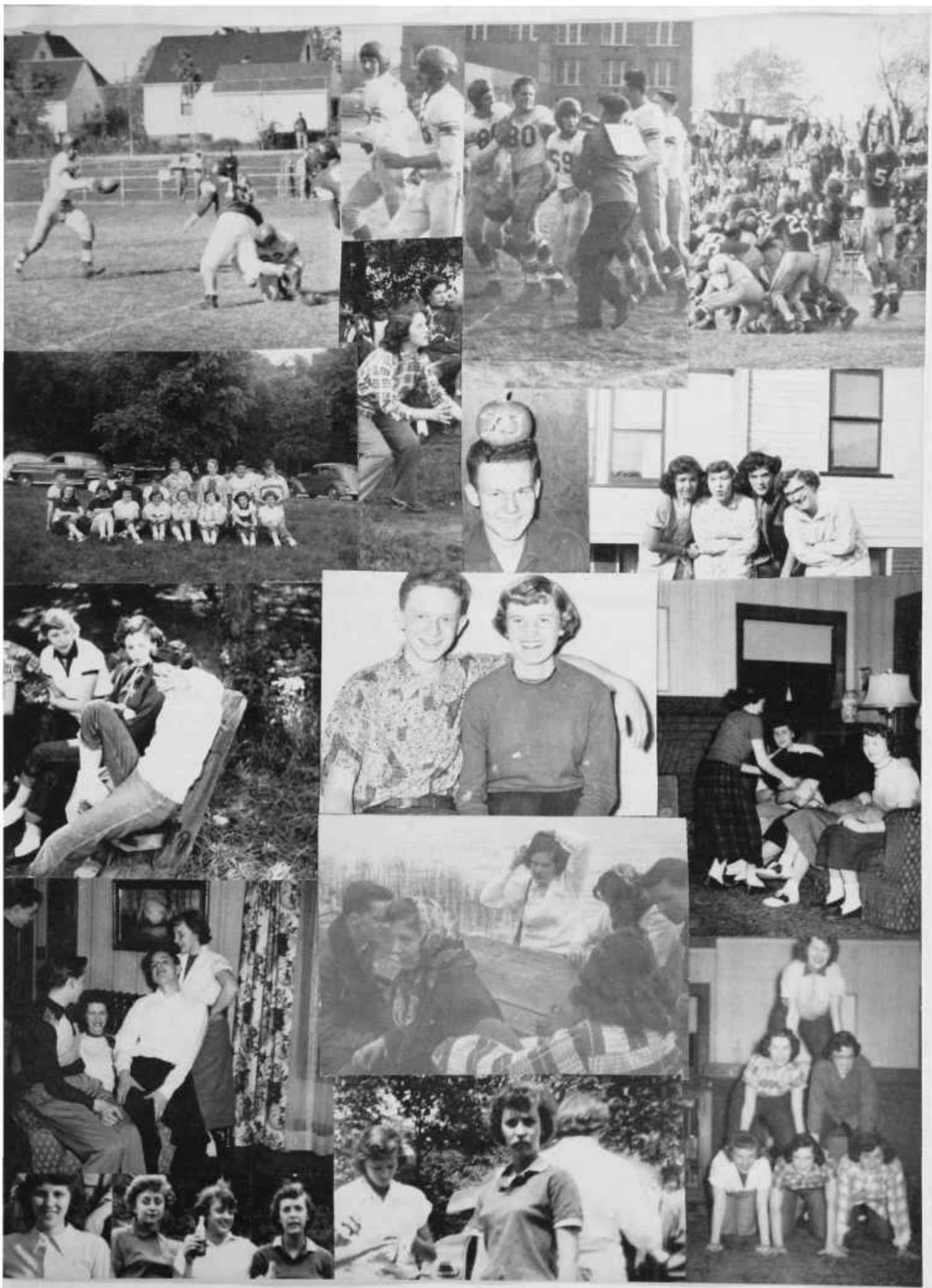
