"Mae" Sikorski and "Sally" Krstein won honors in ping pong and badmitton respectively, while "Pretzie" Pecl, "Amy" Minto, and "Daisy" Schubert enjoyed swimmin in the YWCA swimmin hole to corn jug musik.

Our first brothers and sisters ta hold public office of are class wuz "Jodi" Gercle, President, "Yodi" Young, Vice President; "Janie" Hahn, Secretary, "Lulabelle" Stazione, Treasurer; "Daisy" Schubert, Social Chairman.

Ta lead us brothers and sisters on ta are 12B semester wuz "Jodi" Gerdle, President; "Del" Keller, Vice President; "Amy" Minto, Secretary; "Annie" Bertin, Treasurer; and "Daisy" Schubert, Social Chairman.


