
Key Concept

Our complaints against God provoke Him to anger!



Satan uses our jealousy and complaining as a clever strategy to undermine our obedience and thankfulness

Satan – "and you will be like God, knowing good and evil"

Do everything without complaining and arguing

- •What did God first do when he heard the Israelites complaining about no meat? He sent fire to rage against them, destroying some of the people
- •What was this place known as after that?

Taberah = "the place of burning"

•The Israelites were quick to remember all the fish, cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions and garlic in Egypt but conveniently forgot what in their complaints?

They were slaves!
