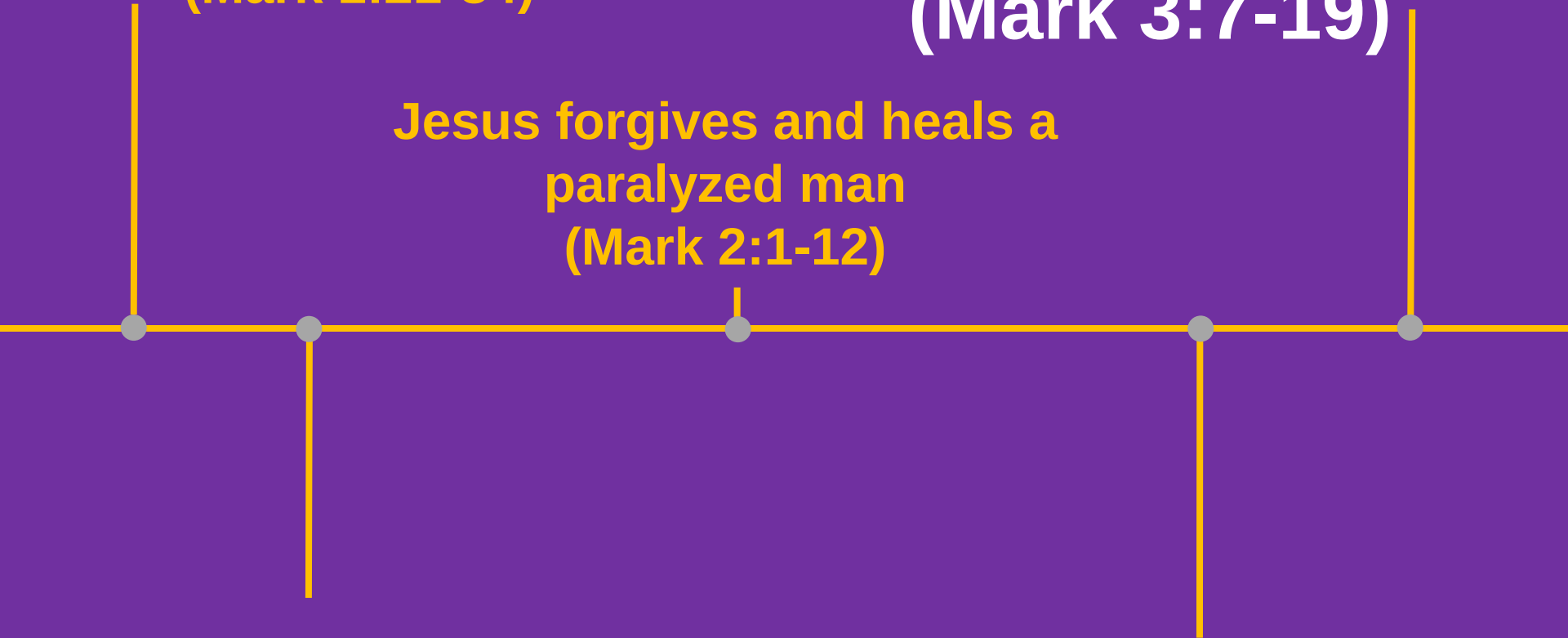

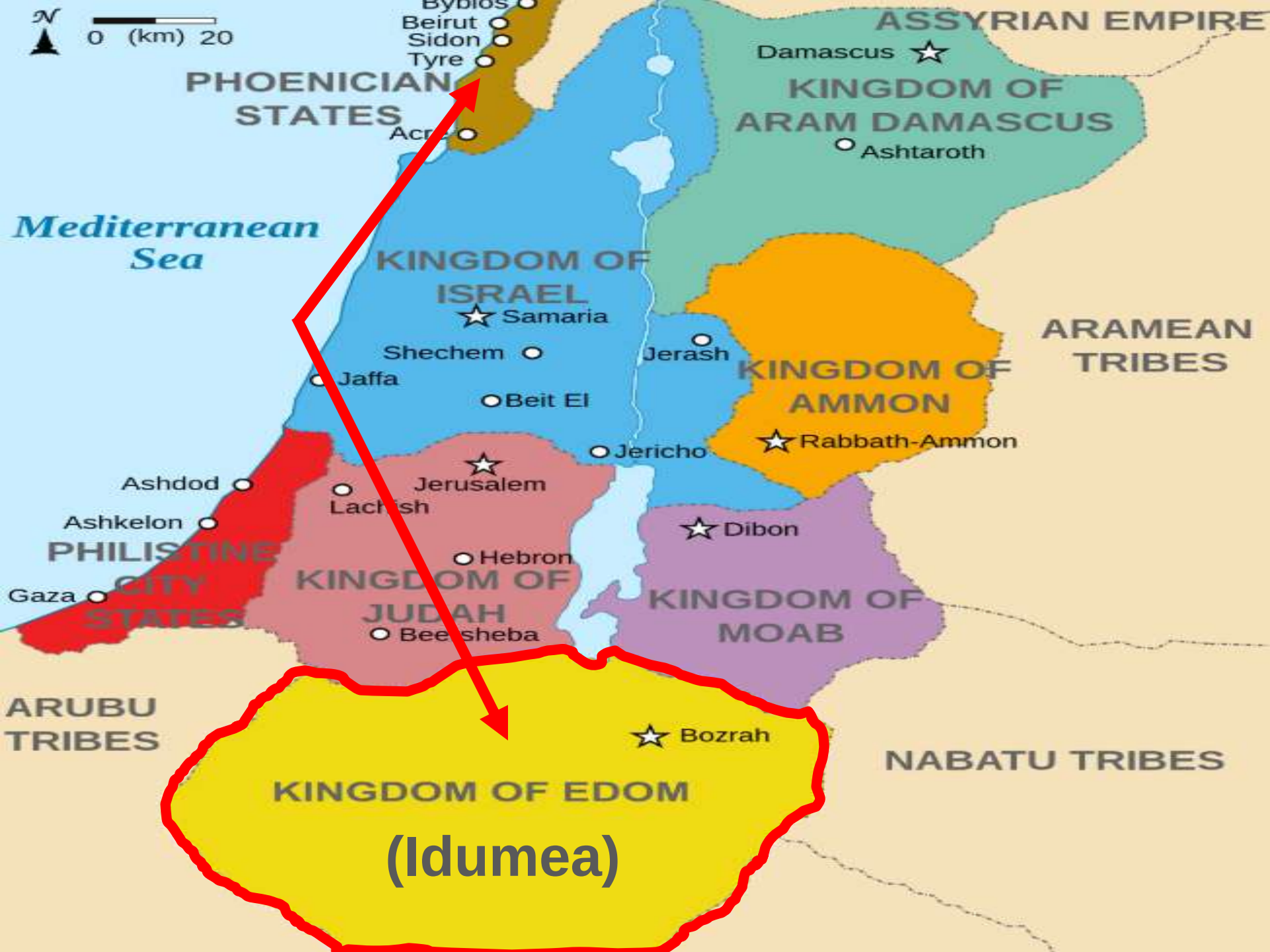

- (T/F) Jesus picked 12 disciples, one from each tribe of Israel?

False – 12 simply represented the number of Tribes of Israel. Many of the disciples were related and from the Galilee region.

- What is a good description for the massive difference between the two groups pursuing Jesus?

One group was pursuing Jesus as a consuming crowd needing miracles the other was a select group of committed disciples to carry His authority / message into the world.

•What is significant about the Mark 3:7-8 locations listed?

Jesus' ministry focused on Jewish people, but He intentional crossed borders into gentile territories to show the message was for all.

•What are three specific reasons Jesus appoints the disciples in Mark 3?

- 1) To be with Him (relational discipleship)**
- 2) To be sent out to preach
(mission & evangelism)**
- 3) To have authority to cast out demons, heal the sick (spiritual warfare)**

•Can you name other significant biblical events that involved mountains and divine revelation / covenant-making events?

- 1) Mt Sinai – Ten Commandments**
- 2) Mt of Olives – site of Jesus' ascension**
- 3) Mt Ararat – Noah's Ark resting place**
- 4) Mt Nebo – Where God allowed Moses to view promised land**
- 5) Mt Hermon – Moses and Elijah appear with Jesus (Transfiguration)**
- 6) Mt Carmel – Elijah's showdown with prophets of Baal and Ashtoreth**
