

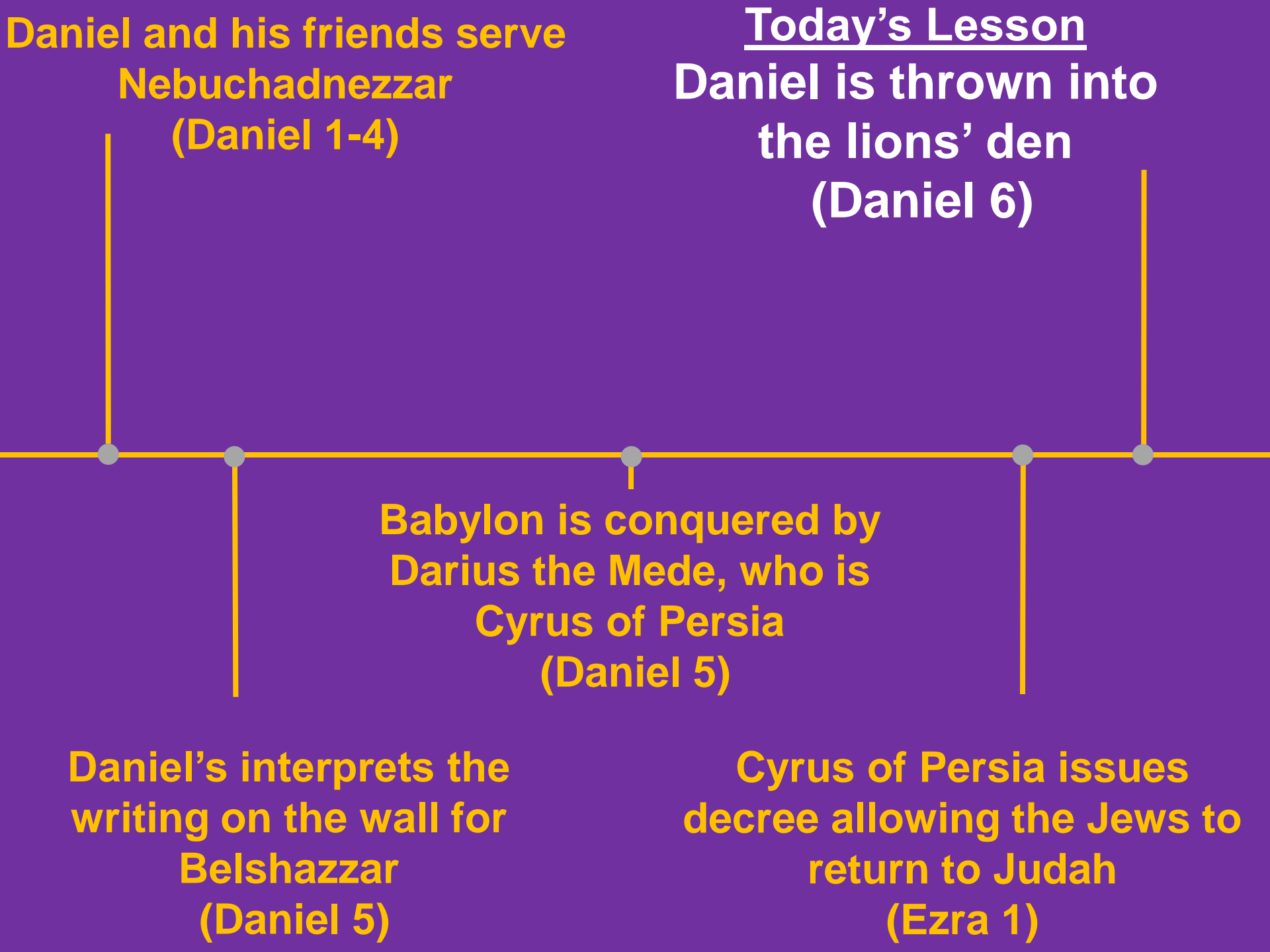

Daniel Exiled to Babylon 605BC

THE EXILE: Judah fell to King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon. Many of the inhabitants were deported to Babylon. In 539 BC, Babylon fell to the Medes and Persians. In 538 BC, King Cyrus of Persia issued a proclamation allowing the Jewish people to return to Palestine. Some Jews stayed in Babylon, but those who returned went back in several groups over many years. The temple was rebuilt in 516 BC, 70 years after its destruction.

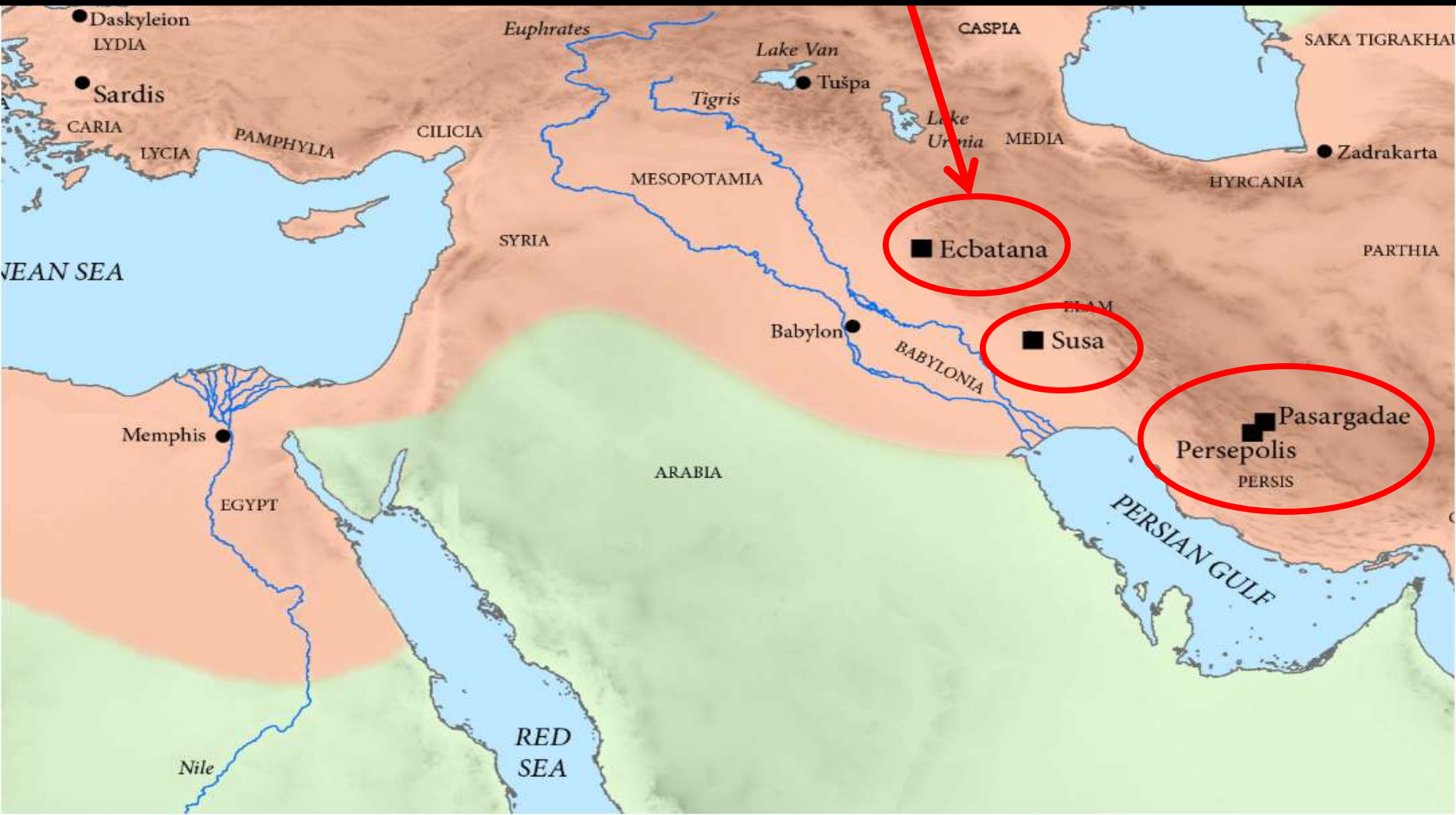

•What are some key attributes of how Daniel responded to what he knew could likely be his death sentence for not worshipping Darius?

- 1) He showed unwavering faith*
- 2) He boldly proclaimed God's control (over man's authority / worldly things)*
- 3) Trust in God's will. It is not wrong to say "if its God's will" Because you have your own will that may not be aligned with God's will*
- 4) Non-negotiable obedience where God is the priority*
- 5) Public witness and testimony to God's sovereignty*

- **How old was Daniel when he was throw into the lion's den?**

~ 82 – 83 years old

- **Why was Darius prohibited from changing any law once sealed?**

Medo-Persians believed that the king's word was divine and infallible / constitutional monarchy

- What exactly is a satrap and what was their purpose? • A high-ranking provincial governor
- They were responsible for taxes, order, and justice, holding significant civil / military authority
- The main reason any satrap would wish to have Daniel killed? Daniel was placed over them to prevent corruption and accurate reporting of taxes / empire mgmt
- (T/F) Daniel returned to Jerusalem once Darius declared the decree to the exiles? False – Daniel was advanced aged and a valuable adviser to the new Persian rulers
