
# God Intervenes For His People Judges 16:4-5; 16-30

Othniel, Ehud, and Shamgar Judge Israel (Jud 3)





#### **Chronology of Judges Timeline**

#### 1350 - 1014 BC for a total of 336 years.



OTTIMILL	Aram, he went to war and delivered Israel.	40
EHUD	After 18 years of oppression from King Eglon of Moab, he killed Eglon, went to war against Moab, and was victorious	80
SHAMGAR	Killed 600 of the Philistines with an ox goad	?
DEBORAH	After 20 years of oppression from King Jabin of Canaan, she convinced Barak to attack and was victorious.	40
GIDEON	After 7 years of Midianite oppression, he defeated the Midianites with only 300 men, using trumpets and jars.	40
TOLA	The son of Puah son of Dodo from the tribe of Issachar. He lived in Ephraim	23
JAIR	A man from Gilead who had 30 sons who rode 30 donkeys, and they had 30 towns in Gilead	22
JEPHTHAT	After 18 years of Ammonite oppression, he delivered Israel after making a vow with the Lord.	6
IBZAN	From Bethlehem, he had 30 sons and 30 daughters	7
ELON	From the tribe of Zebulun	10
ABDON	Son of Hillel, he had 40 sons, 30 grandsons and rode on 70 donkeys	8
SAMSON	A Nazarite with superhuman strength. He killed 1,000 Philistines with a jawbone; destroyed the Philistine temple while blinded and shackled	20




#### **Discovery**

Two Philistine temples have been uncovered by archaeologists. One at Tel Qasile, in northern Tel Aviv, and one in Tel Migne, ancient Ekron 21 miles south of Tel Aviv. Both temples share a unique design. The roof was supported by two central pillars made of wood and rested on stone support bases. With the pillars being about six feet apart, a strong man could dislodge them from their stone bases and bring the entire roof crashing down.

- 3. Avoid ritually impure acts (contact w/dead)
