
Repentance Jonah 3:4-10, 4:1-2, 6-11

Elijah performs miracles and prophesies to Israel (1 Kings 17 - 2 Kings 2)


Assyria besieges and conquers Israel, deporting the people

Israel's kings persist in doing evil in the Lord's sight (2 Kings 14-17)














Why was the city of Nineveh chosen by God for Jonah to go proclaim His judgment?
It was the capital city of Assyria (wicked kingdom)

- •What was the length of Jonah's prophecy message to Nineveh? In Hebrew only 5 words
- What is the meaning of Jonah's name in Hebrew? Dove

- •What eventually became of the city of Nineveh?
- Eventually, it was destroyed for returning to wickedness and sin about 150 years later ~ 612 BC

- •(T/F) Jonah was one of multiple prophets that Jesus likened Himself to?
- False Only Jonah (Matt 12:39)

- •Why would Jonah select Tarshish?
- It was considered the farthest known place from Nineveh.

- •What is unique about the book of Jonah in the old testament?
- It is focused on a gentile nation on foreign soil, and is a narrative rather than collection of prophecies.

- •What is a good way to sum up the story of Jonah in order to relate it to your life or use it to help others?
- God's boundless mercy, reveals that His compassion extends to all people, including a nation's enemies, those bound by sin. And, anyone repentant and wanting that second chance can find redemption and mercy in the Lord's grace.
