You will be aware that a debate on 'Covid 19 pandemic response and trends in excess deaths' is taking place on Thursday 18th April 2024 in The House Of Commons; a long awaited debate that follows a well-attended Adjournment Debate in October 2023 and Westminster Hall debate in January 2024.

As your constituent I urge you to attend this debate, understanding its significance and the high level of public support Andrew Bridgen MP has, given that he seemingly stands almost entirely alone in raising such concerns and asking these difficult questions.

Many agree that his questions relating to high all-cause death rates over the last two years need to be seriously considered and thoroughly investigated. Andrew Bridgen MP continues to represent the interests of the public; something that to all appearances is a rarity in the House of Commons these days.

As per a government report published in March 2024 on Key Statistics for the NHS and increased pressures following the pandemic [CBP-7281.pdf \(parliament.uk\)](#) 'The number of people visiting A&E in winter 2023/24 was above pre-pandemic levels. A new record high was reached in December 2022.'

With regard to ambulance response times and demands, the report shows there were a steady 2,000 calls for life threatening/serious emergencies (category 1) per day pre-pandemic. These fell in lockdowns when people were told to "stay home and protect the NHS." Ever since the vaccine rollout there has been an average of 2,500 category 1 calls per day - a 25% increase which continues to this day. Additionally, included in the report published in March this year; 'In February 2024 there were 2,649 category 1 ambulance incidents every day on average – up from 1,953 per day in February 2020' (35% more than in February 2020).

The data shows we have a serious problem, with an excess predominantly in cardiovascular deaths, though it seems almost impossible to get those in power to acknowledge the concerning mortality data. With the 'safe and effective' narrative still being preached by leaders and MPs in the commons, I and many thousands of others believe it is time that the overzealous championing of the covid vaccine, along with the denial of the vaccine rollout and its correlation to excess deaths, ends now.

As your constituent I am requesting that you be in attendance at this debate scheduled for 14:00 on Thursday 18th April.
