Malawi Update

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE (WWW.LIVINGSTEPS4MEDICAL.ORG)

One of the biggest issues Malawian Villagers face is safe and effective health care. The longer we are here the more we realize the need for immediate, efficient, and safe medical care. Currently we are sending people to a local private clinic in Chiringa, but this still presents some issues. We have concluded that the best way to provide care is to own and operate our own medical clinic. This is a fairly simple undertaking in Malawi that only requires a government certificate to operate a clinic, and to hire a nurse or other qualified medical practitioner for the day to day treatment operations. This would give us control over the quality, the cleanliness, and the efficiency of the operation. As always, the only hard part to opening the Living Steps Private Medical Clinic is funding. The good news is we have already received a \$3000.00 donation and once operations have begun, even at low cost and pro bono, it will be self-supporting. We need to actually have our official Malawi NGO (Living Steps) finalized & registered with the Government before we can open a clinic. As of now all NGO paperwork has been filed with the Malawian Government, building plans are completed and a building site is secured.
