Pastor's Spin



Siblings in Christ of Covenant,

I remember when *The Passion of the Christ* first arrived in theaters. It was my freshman year of college, and oddly enough, I was taking an Introduction to the Bible class, a course I figured would be relatively easy being the son of a Sunday school teacher, even if I only remembered about half of what I was taught in those makeshift classrooms at the back of the church building. Instead, there was

much more to Scripture than I anticipated: historical context, literary styles, geography, and so much more. The Bible came to life in a way I never imagined during those several weeks.

When our professor passed out the daunting syllabus on the first day of class, I don't believe it included a slot for a film that was attempting to make a certain part of Scripture come to life in a way that had not quite been pulled off before. Nevertheless, our professor coordinated with the rest of our schedules to meet up at the theater several miles away from campus to watch *The Passion of the Christ* together, and then for the next class, we would discuss our reactions and thoughts, and he would do his best to provide the historical context and whatever else good professors would do.

I still remember at the conclusion of the movie, when the credits scrolled down the screen, how the entire audience seemed to sit in stunned silence. It was rather overwhelming, even sad and depressing for some. And yet, for many years after that night, it was part of my Good Friday ritual to watch *The Passion of the Christ*, as if that was by far the best way to connect with the true essence of that rather somber day. Sure, we've done our best to bring that holy day to life in worship with extinguishing candles, reading through the appropriate parts of Scripture, perhaps some nails, even a Bible slamming for good measure, at times. But, obviously, it's not quite the same as viewing the sometimes gory moments of Jesus' final bodily earthly days on a screen.

Soon enough, that Good Friday ritual faded away for me. I wondered if that really was what Good Friday was supposed to be about? To find some way to immerse yourself into the pain and anguish of what Jesus endured long ago? Or maybe it was meant to be about Christ's mindboggling and ultimate example of sacrificial love brought to life on the cross. Maybe it was meant to be beautiful. Granted, the crucifixion is still a brutal and heinous form of punishment on a human being. There's no getting around that. It is sad and disturbing, but the act of love for all humanity can also be a wonderful and hear-warming experience as well. It's not always easy to pull off such a both-and on Good Friday.

The third verse from Isaac Watt's When I Survey the Wondrous Cross captures this quite well:

See, from his head, his hands, his feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down. Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?

After all, it is through that cross that we are reminded that God joins us in our sorrows and joys and everything in between. This is the God who loves us to the point that we are already crowned into a glory and honor of being one with Christ, a bond that can never be taken away from us. Evidently, Christ believed in bringing that to life so much that not even a cross with all its hate and evil could stop him. For that Greatest News of Good Friday and all days, we most certainly give thanks to God, indeed!


