





First Reading: Genesis 1:1–2:4a

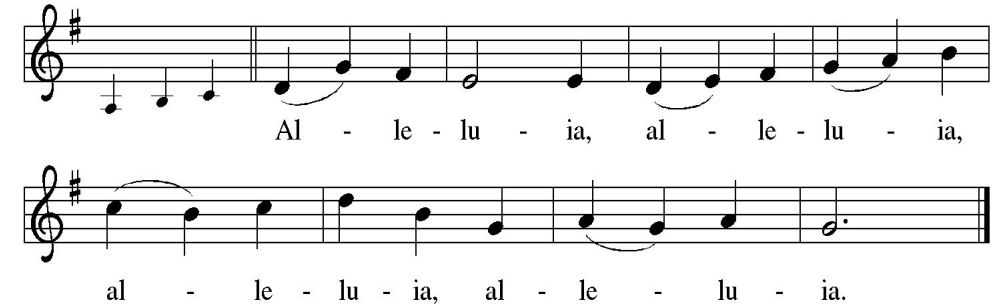
