That means loving someone you may not know, or someone that looks different than you, or someone that has different beliefs than you, or someone that you don't like. All without expecting anything in return.

Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted

#### Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

When Jesus was telling this parable of the Good Samaritan, after saying that the priest and the Levite passed by, his listeners were probably expecting Jesus would then go on to say that a Jewish layperson came along and did the decent thing. The story would then have a more kind and positive tone, and it would have been appreciated by them. However, the story turned out to be much more subversive than that. It was not a Jewish layperson who responded to the broken traveler, but a despised Samaritan neighbor. A member of a group traditionally demonized by Jews showed what the keeping of God's law really meant in practice. When Jesus asked the Jewish lawyer, 'Which of the three do you think proved himself to be a neighbor?' he could not even bring himself to say, 'the Samaritan.' He simply said, 'the one who showed compassion.'

The story Jesus told, like all his parables, can be heard at many levels. One of the ways we can appreciate this story is to hear it as a reminder to us that those we are tempted to dismiss and look down on can often teach us what it means to live as God intends us to live. The Samaritan in the parable was an image of Jesus - just as Jesus is an image of God, as St. Paul reminds us in today's second reading.

Jesus, in drawing a picture of the compassionate response of the Samaritan to the wounded traveler, Jesus was drawing a picture of his own compassionate ministry. The parable suggests that Jesus figures can be found in unexpected places and come as unexpected servants. It invites us to recognize goodness wherever it is found, especially when it is found among those, we are prone to dismiss or reject.

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

The parable also reminds us that help can come to us from unexpected persons. The wounded man in the parable was presumed to be a Jew. He would not have expected help to come from a Samaritan. We can sometimes make the same presumption in our own lives. At crucial moments we can receive help from people we would not have expected to help us. In our hour of need we can discover that our assessment of someone was unfair, that our

expectations of others were far too selfish. In the parable Jesus suggests that God can sometimes come to us in unfamiliar disguises, and that his compassionate love can be revealed to us by the outsider, the stranger, the one we would normally have considered enemy to us. There can be a resistance in us to receiving God's service at the hands of those from whom we feel alienated. When people with whom we are at odds reach out in us in our hour of need, we can be tempted to keep them at bay. The Jewish lawyer struggled to accept that God's compassionate presence could be revealed through the despised Samaritan. The parable calls on us to allow God to come to us in and through those of God's own choosing. The parable that Jesus tells, invites us to find our own self within the story, to identify with one or other of the characters there. In the story of the good Samaritan, we might be inclined at times to identify with the halfdead traveler. Life has a way of leaving us half-dead at times. If we are drawn to find ourselves there, by the roadside, we can make our own the prayer contained in today's responsorial psalm, "Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live." We might also need to pray for the willingness to accept God's compassion from whoever and whatever direction it comes.

However, today's parable more directly invites us to identify with the Samaritan. What Jesus said to the lawyer, he says to us all: 'Go, and do the same yourself,' in other words, 'Go, and be the good Samaritan.' We all have the potential to make tangible God's compassionate presence to others. The first step in doing that is to notice our brothers and sisters in need. It is first said of the Samaritan that he saw the traveler, he noticed him. Noticing is a small but significant first step. Yet, it is not enough just to notice, we must respond as well. The priest and the Levite(ministers) also noticed, they too saw the wounded person. What distinguished the Samaritan from them was that he allowed himself to be deeply moved by what he saw. Compassion involves that deep inner movement which comes from allowing ourselves to experience something of the pain of the other. That inner movement will lead to some form of outer movement; some proper action on behalf of the other. Such, according to the gospel reading, is the path to life, being good disciples of Christ. 
