"I tell you, the latter went home justified, for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Lk: 18:14

Take a Knee in Victory Formation

Jesus tells a parable (an earthly story with a spiritual meaning) "to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else" Lk. 18:9. A Pharisee and a Tax Collector both approached God in prayer. The Pharisee was convinced that his righteous acts caused him to be in right standing with God. The Tax Collector knew he was sinful and begged God for mercy.

Here are lessons we can learn:

- 1. Stop comparing yourself with other people. My professor used to say, "The favorite indoor sport of the Christian is to compare ourselves with each other." "I am not as bad as her; I am not as horrible as him." The Apostle Paul said that when we compare ourselves with one another, "In so doing, it is not wise" 2 Cor. 10:12. I was on my way to Mass and at the McDonald's (on the corner) across the street from the church was the familiar young man with no shirt on dancing like Michael Jackson as the cars passed by. I remarked to myself, "Look at that fool!" The Holy Spirit spoke to my heart and said, "Jenkins, if it wasn't for Me, you would be on that corner!" In A.A. there is no comparing because the members realize they all need help and are recovering from alcohol or drugs. Religious folk tend to look down on others.
- 2. Your righteousness alone is not enough for Salvation. The Pharisee was full of his own righteousness; he had no need or room for God's righteousness. The Tax Collector was clearly aware of his need for God's righteousness and humbly begged and prayed for it, "O God, be merciful to me a sinner" Lk. 18:13. "A person is made righteous not by obedience to the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ" Gal. 2:16. "Our righteousness are like filthy rags" Isaiah 64:6. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not works, lest anyone should boast" Eph. 2:8-9.

In a college football game the Miami Hurricanes were leading the Georgia Tech Yellowjackets by a score of 20-17. There was 34 seconds left on the clock before the end of the game. Georgia Tech had no time-outs. It was third down and the only thing Miami had to do was

get into a victory formation. The victory formation is when the quarterback gets under center, and the center hikes the ball to the quarterback. Behind the quarterback are two players; generally two running backs who are close to the quarterback. All the quarterback had to do was get the ball from the center and take a knee. If the Miami Hurricanes' quarterback had received the ball and took a knee in the victory formation; they would have won the game. Instead, they got a call from the sideline to keep running plays; rather than getting into the victory formation.

Because they ran plays; the running back fumbled the ball. Georgia Tech recovered the ball with 26 seconds left on the clock and in two passing plays, and no time outs-the Yellowjackets won the football game. It wasn't because of the brilliance of the Yellowjackets. The Miami Hurricanes lost the entire game because they refused to take a knee in the victory formation! Some of you are still running around comparing yourselves with others; trying to impress God with your righteous acts. We have the victory by Jesus dying on the cross. "Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" I Cor. 15:57. Jesus wants us to humble ourselves by taking a knee before Him (Phil. 2:10-11). "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" 2 Chron. 7:14.

That's the victory formation!


