

Luke 10:2

# Things we must remember when *harvesting* (as a laborer) for Christ

Today's Gospel reading is recorded in **Luke 10.** Jesus sent out seventy-two followers **ahead** of Him to locations **where He planned to visit.** Based on Luke's account, what can **we** as modern-day disciples learn from this ancient commissioning?

- 1. Introduce people to Christ. (V. 9) "Say to them, the kingdom of God is at hand for you." A while ago, I met an old friend whom I hadn't seen in years. We were talking (I believe) in the vestibule of the church after a funeral. As she and I continued to talk, I noticed a man standing closely behind her. I finally spoke to him: "Hi brother, how are you? My old friend quickly turned around and saw the man standing behind her. She grabbed his hand and said, "O' Michael, I want you to meet the love of my life, my husband, Paul." I didn't realize she was married. All that time, her husband had been waiting to be introduced. Christ is with us always (Matt. 28:20). Are you introducing Jesus to your friends, coworkers, parents, even your enemies, or is He just standing there waiting on you to introduce Him?
- 2. Prepare people to receive Christ into their lives. Amos 4:12 says, "Prepare to meet your God". Other translations say, "Prepare to meet your Maker." We are to prepare people to meet Christ. My Mother did that with her caregivers while in her eighties! Jesus sent the 72 out to prepare the people to meet Him! You are not prepared to meet your Maker if you are not doing anything for the God who made you.

#### 3. Harvesting is only for a short period.

Jesus is sending them out during a harvest, which is **only for a season.** I enjoy hotels with a Continental Breakfast. When I check in, the receptionist will say, "From 6 AM to 9 AM tomorrow, we will have a complimentary breakfast in the dining room." The next morning, it's so difficult to get dressed and go downstairs, but I struggle and get out of bed because I want to take advantage of the **free breakfast! Salvation is free, but there is a time limit!** The door will be locked (cf. Matt. 25:10-11). If you don't take advantage of it, it will cost **you your soul!** In Mark 8:36, Jesus asked, "What does it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and loses his soul?" Christians have the answer to eternal

life for our souls. Why do we keep quiet?

#### 4. Know that we are in enemy territory.

Jesus said, "Behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves" Luke 10:3. Why did Jesus say that? St. Paul writes in 2 Cor. 4:4: "The god of this age [this world] has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, so that they may not see the light of the Gospel." Jesus is warning us that the god [lower case "g"] has blinded the minds of unbelievers; and they can't receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him (1 Cor. 2:14). Satan is the god of this age! Christians are working behind enemy lines.

**5. Stay humble.** (V. 2) "The harvest is abundant..." Jesus is telling us that the harvest is plentiful and ready to be picked, but do you know when wheat is ready for harvesting? How do you know if you are ready to work as a laborer for Christ in His fields? When the wheat is **straight up**, it's **not** ready for harvesting. It's too green on the inside. When



the seed heads are nodding or bending toward the ground, that's when it's ready to be picked. For us to work in the fields as laborers for Christ, we have to be ready to be harvested ourselves! Some of us may not be ready for picking because we are conceited, arrogant, and proud. "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble" James 4:6. Pride will keep us from being laborers in the field for Christ and will keep our names from being written in Heaven (cf. Luke 10:20).




