Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted

Sixth Sunday of Easter (Year C)

The Gospel passage today reminds us that the Holy Spirit, abiding within us, is our Teacher, our Advocate, and the Source of our peace and joy. The passage offers a vision of hope as well. Jesus promises his followers that the Holy Spirit will come and instruct them in everything they need to know. There is no need to be afraid anymore.

Let us be aware of the abiding presence of God within us: We live in the New Covenant of Jesus, daily facing uncertainty, conflict, and temptations. It is the abiding presence of God within us that enables us to face the future with undying hope and true Christian courage. The Holy Spirit, Whom the risen Lord asked His Father to send upon His Church, prompts us to turn to His Holy Scriptures for support and encouragement, enables us to learn the Divine truths, and always grants us His peace. However, to be able to receive these gifts, it is necessary for us to spend a little time each day in personal prayer, talking to God and listening to Him. The Gospel of John continues to recount Jesus' farewell discourse after they shared the Last Supper.

Today's Gospel passage gives us a foreshadowing of the indwelling of the Holy Trinity in our souls, and the special role of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Jesus affirms the Apostles that even though He will no longer be visibly with them, he will continue to be present among them through the Holy Spirit. The Spirit of Truth will continue teaching them and helping them to understand and to build on what Jesus has already taught them. The Advocate will bring no new revelation because God has already revealed Himself through Jesus. But the Advocate will deepen their understanding of the revelation given by Jesus.

He gives his apostles, and us his missionary disciples four gifts: First, he gives his Love, which will enable us to keep his word. Second, he gives us the Holy Spirit, who will guide us in everything we need to know. The Holy Spirit is the abiding Love of God available to us, enabling us to accept the friendship of Jesus, while imitating him with spiritual gifts, and obeying his commands as the Christ. Third, he gives us his Peace to strengthen us on our journey of faith against fear in the times of trouble. This "Peace" is not just the absence of conflict, but also the far wider Deacon Drenon's lesson of *"In Spite of Love,"* we heard last

Sunday. This is the total well-being of the personal love of self and community. The promise of the Holy Spirit, will bring a peace that will lighten our fears on the difficult journey ahead. The Holy Spirit is available as Comforter and Guide to those who believe in Jesus and follow in his way.

God-the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – IS pure Love. This Love, in the Triune God, comes and lives in us, it takes up residence in us and lives in our soul. When God's unconditional love lives in us, and we live in Him, there is much more peace in our hearts, our families, our Churches, our offices, our workplaces, our schools, and, in our world. Fourth, Jesus rewards us with the assurance of his second coming. We live in the New Covenant of Jesus, daily facing uncertainty, conflict, and temptations. It is the enduring presence of God within us, through the Holy Spirit that enables us to face the future. Using the Spirits' gift of undying Hope and Christian Courage. The Holy Spirit at Pentecost, sent upon all believers by God the Father, at the request of our Risen Lord Jesus, prompts us to turn to His Holy Scriptures for support and encouragement, enabling us to learn through the Spiritual gifts it brings, and always grants us His peace.

However, to be able to receive these gifts, it is necessary for us to spend a little time each day in personal prayer, talking to God and listening to Him. We must deepen our relationship with Jesus, learn to communicate with him, and love him. When we listen to the Holy Spirit, we will know the plan for our life and the solutions for whatever problems we face. We will be able to love our brothers and sisters in Christ, and there will be a presence of Peace within us. The Holy Spirit teaches us through the Scriptures and preaching during the Holy Mass as well as in our communal prayer and our private reading of Scripture. Jesus loves us and comes to continually be in Communion with us. As we celebrate this Eucharistic meal at this our Holy Mass, let us celebrate in a distinct way the price Jesus paid for our redemption. May this Eucharistic celebration empower us to lead a true Life of the Spirit. Knowing that the Lord Jesus is with us always. When the Mass is ended, we are told to go forth in the peace of Christ – and all this takes place under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
