





Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted commentaries and homilies

Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time (Cycle A)

Matthew's account of the Beatitudes marks the beginning of Jesus's long Sermon on the Mount. Through the Beatitudes Jesus sets out the most radical part of his Gospel. He presents to his disciples and his other listeners a vision of the world turned upside down. He presents his values as being the direct opposite of the values of this world. In the Kingdom of God, he is telling us, it is the poor, the hungry, the mourners and the persecuted who are valued while it is the rich, the satisfied, the friendly and those who are lauded that are at the bottom of the pile.

Today's gospel reading, the beatitudes, gives us an extremely focused picture of Christ. We sometimes read the beatitudes as if they were speaking about diverse kinds of people, the poor in spirit, the gentle and so on. All of these terms are several ways of describing one person, and the one person that the beatitudes portray is primarily Jesus himself.

In the beatitudes he was giving his disciples a kind of a self-portrait. Self-portraits are not always reliable. Our own description of who we are may be quite different from other people's description of us. The real truth of who we are is probably a combination of both. (mirrors do not lie)

In the case of Jesus, however, we can be sure that a self-portrait is a correct one.

He is poor in spirit, trusting in God before all else.

He is gentle, in that he is firmly committed to God's purpose, yet without any trace of arrogance.

He is the one who mourns because people are not living according to God's will.

He himself hungers and thirsts to do God's will; he is merciful to all who are broken in body and or in spirit.

He is pure in heart in that his heart is not divided but is totally given over to God's purpose.

He is the peacemaker who seeks, by his life and his death, to reconcile all people to God and to each other.

He is prepared to be persecuted in the doing of God's will and in the carrying out of God's purpose.

This portrait that Jesus gives of himself is also intended as a portrait of those who would be his disciples. It is a portrait of the person we are all called to be. Each one of the beatitudes puts before us a different side of that very complete person we are destined to become. In a sense, the beatitudes stand or fall together; we cannot take one and ignore the others, because as soon as we ignore any one of them, the others are weakened. If there is one beatitude that is more fundamental than the

others it is the one that Jesus has placed first, 'Blessed are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven.' The poor in spirit are those who know their need of God. They are those who recognize their dependence on God for everything that is good, who realize that, without God's help, they cannot become fully alive, fully human. We need God's grace, God's Spirit, if we are to become the person that the beatitudes are calling us to become.

When Lent begins this month on Ash Wednesday, we might take the beatitudes as our companion on our Lenten journey and keep them before our eyes as a goal as we strive for Christian identity on our journey towards Easter.

The values then of the Kingdom of God are the direct opposite of the values of this world. And with a few adjustments it is the same today as it was at the time of Christ. The values of this world are the acquisition of wealth, power, and influence. Those who are admired by society at large are those who have single-mindedly risen to the top of the social elite. Usually this has meant them having become extremely self-centered, if not utterly selfish. It has often also meant them disconnecting themselves from their families and friends in the single-minded pursuit of what they regard as excellence. Such people often become detached from ordinary life experiences and the stresses and strains of normal human relationships. They become obsessed with their own self-image and often get hooked on such things as cosmetic surgery and other treatments with the aim of presenting to the world the perfect body. The more we think about people who live their lives like this the shallower we realize that they have become. In their case image has triumphed over reality.

The deeply committed Christian cannot live like this. A dedicated follower, a disciple of Jesus realizes that there are more important things in life than celebrity and achievement. An Apostle of Jesus understands that true fulfillment is only to be found in acquiring the virtues of goodness, faith, hope, kindness, trust and so on. It is only by embracing the Christian virtues that we can ever achieve real and lasting human contentment. The disciple of Christ realizes that true achievement in life only comes about through becoming more authentically human and that the best way to do this is to embrace the values of the Gospel, Jesus teaches us in the Beatitudes.
