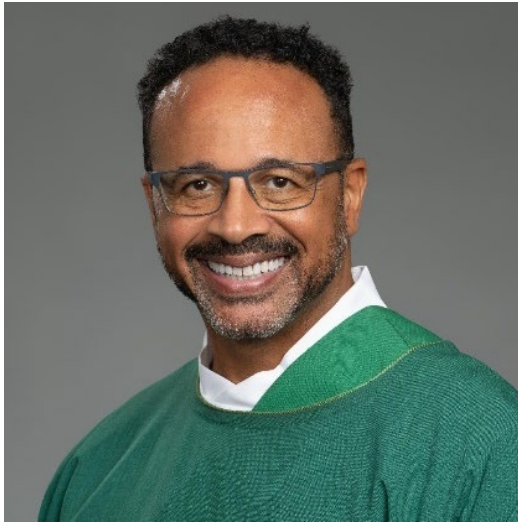

July 19, 2026

God, Please Don't Pull Up the Weeds Early

Happy Sunday! One of the most comforting parables Jesus tells is the story of the wheat and the weeds. A farmer plants good seed, but while everyone is asleep, an enemy scatters weeds throughout the field. When the servants notice the problem, they immediately want to pull the weeds. Surprisingly, the farmer tells them to wait.

Why? Because pulling the weeds too soon might also uproot the wheat.

Jesus is teaching us something profound about God. God is patient.

Our world is filled with both good and evil. More importantly, every one of us carries both wheat and weeds within our own hearts. There are moments when we choose kindness over anger, forgiveness over resentment, generosity over selfishness. Those are the moments when God's grace is flourishing within us.

But there are also moments when pride, jealousy, impatience, selfishness, or sin begin to grow. None of us is completely wheat, and none of us is completely weed. We are works in progress.

The beautiful message of today's Gospel is that God refuses to give up on us. He doesn't pull us up after one bad decision. He doesn't define us by our worst mistake. Instead, He patiently continues to water us with His grace, hoping that the good seed He planted at Baptism will continue to grow.

Perhaps no saint illustrates this better than St. Francis of Assisi. As a young man, Francis was spoiled, self-centered, and more interested in parties and adventure than in serving God. Many people

might have written him off. But God saw something deeper. God saw the wheat hidden beneath the weeds. Through God's mercy, Francis experienced a conversion that transformed not only his own life but the life of the entire Church.

That's good news for all of us.

The Lord is patient because He knows our story isn't finished yet.

At the same time, Jesus reminds us not to become comfortable with the weeds. God's patience is never permission to remain where we are. His mercy always invites us to conversion. Every day He calls us to love more deeply, forgive more freely, serve more generously, and place Him first in our lives.

As members of St. Francis Xavier, we are called to help cultivate wheat wherever we go, in our homes, our workplaces, our schools, and throughout our community. Sometimes that begins simply by offering forgiveness, encouraging someone who has fallen, or extending mercy instead of judgment.

This week, take a few moments to ask yourself: What weeds is God inviting me to remove from my heart? And what wheat is He asking me to cultivate?

May we thank God for His patience with us, and may we become people through whom others experience His grace, mercy, and love.

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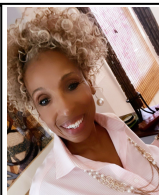


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
