#### **EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURECTION OF** THE LORD



On Easter Sunday, we hear some of Jesus' earliest disciples testify to the unprecedented they event had witnessed. Saint Peter addresses an assembly of Gentiles teaching

them about Jesus and how God raised him from the dead. Saint Paul preaches about the effect Christ's resurrection has had on his life. In the Gospel, Saint Mary Magdalene, the first to see the empty tomb, frantically announces the news to two of Jesus' closest disciples. None of his disciples yet understood that Jesus had to rise from the dead, but the disciple whom Jesus loved believed at once. Let us consider how we ourselves testify to the Resurrection.

# EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD (C)

**April 20, 2025** 

Many of us would say that the people who know us best are those who love us most. Those who have given themselves in love to each other over many years and who have remained faithful to each other know each other in a way that no one else knows them. Those we claim to know we often do not really know because we have no real connection with them. In John's gospel one of Jesus' disciples is always referred to as the disciple that Jesus loved. The fourth evangelist believed that there was a special bond between Jesus and this disciple. Here was a disciple who was completely open to the presence of God's love in the person of Jesus and who responded fully to that love.

For the fourth evangelist, this disciple is the ideal disciple, the disciple we are all called to become. He is portrayed in the fourth gospel as someone who, because of his special bond of love with Jesus, knew Jesus better than any of the other disciples. Here was someone whose knowledge of Jesus was born of a greater love. He saw more clearly and more deeply than others.

In this morning's gospel reading, he alone saw the true significance of the empty tomb of Jesus that was first discovered by the women on that Easter morning. In the words of the gospel reading, 'he saw and believed.' Because of the empty tomb alone, he recognized that Jesus had been raised from the dead. The other disciples came to this realization only after the risen Lord had appeared to them.

What the beloved disciple recognized, what John believed, is what brings us together here on this Easter Sunday: God has raised his Son to new life. This is the heart of our Christian faith. As St Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians, 'if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain, and your faith has been in vain.' This statement was made by a man who a few years earlier persecuted Christians for believing in Jesus. If Jesus had not been raised from the dead, his life and work would have been a glorious, but nonetheless tragic, failure.

Without Jesus' resurrection from the dead, what he began would have petered out. The resurrection was God's resounding 'yes' to all that Jesus said and did, to all that he lived for and died for. In raising his Son from the dead, God raised up all that Jesus proclaimed by his words and deeds, by his life and death. Because of Jesus' resurrection, we can

recognize his life and death as the manifestation of God's love and the revelation of God's will for our lives.

Jesus' resurrection has been described as the keystone without which the entire archway would collapse. That is why Easter, and not Christmas, is the most important feast in the church's year. That is why the season of Easter is seven weeks long, running right up to the feast of Pentecost, while the feast of Christmas is only twelve days long.

As we celebrate this great feast of Easter with flowers and song and "alleluia" not only because it has to do with Jesus, but because it is a feast that has to do with all of us. Christ's triumph over death is also our triumph. We all share in Christ's triumph through baptism.

We too have been plunged into Christ's risen life. As Paul says

in his letter to the Romans, 'the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you.' The Spirit is the first fruit of that fullness of life that Jesus now lives and that we are all destined to inherit. Because Jesus has been raised from the dead, all of us who have been baptized and are united with him through faith are Easter people. We live in the light of Easter. If you were to find an image of the Christian life in today's gospel reading, it would not be the sad journey of Mary Magdalene to the tomb in the darkness; it would be much more the excited running to the tomb of the beloved disciple and Peter in the early light or, even more so, the subsequent journey of Mary Magdalene who, having met the risen Lord, went to the disciples to announce, 'I have seen the Lord'. Because of Easter, because of our conviction that, in the person of Christ, life has triumphed over death, we can approach with expectation whatever it might be in our life that seems to be a tomb, trusting that signs of new life are to be found there. Because of Easter we know that even our darkest moments, our Golgotha experiences, are bathed in the light of the risen Christ. Because of Easter we are also sent forth, like Mary Magdalene, as messengers of the risen Lord. Easter commits us to resisting all forms of death and violence; it commissions us to be channels of God's vibrant life to all who are in darkness and the shadow of death. In renewing our baptism this morning, we renew our response to that Easter commission of discipleship.
