

Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted

Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

In the story that Jesus told in today's gospel reading an exceedingly rich man failed to notice the destitute Lazarus at his gate. He must have seen Lazarus, almost every day at his gate, but he did not notice him. The parable suggests that the rich man failed to notice not because he was too busy, but because he was too self-absorbed. He was so immersed in his own self-indulgent lifestyle that he had lost the ability to notice the likes of Lazarus at his gate. The gospel reading also suggests that his lifestyle so absorbed him that he had ceased to notice God or God's call. If he had been attentive to God's word in Moses and the prophets, he would have recognized that God was calling out to him through Lazarus who sat at his gate.

This parable in this morning's gospel reading is about a great gulf between two individuals, a rich man who is nameless and a poor man who is named Lazarus, which means in Hebrew 'God is my help.' In this life, Lazarus is physically close to the rich man, but he might as well be a hundred miles away for all the connection there is between them. When the story moves to the next life, Abraham, with Lazarus at his side, replies to the rich man, 'between us and you, a great gulf has been fixed.' The chasm that was there in this life has carried over into the next, and at that point nothing can be done about it. When the rich man had it within his power to bridge that gulf in this life, he did not do so.

Lazarus, certainly, desperately wanted to bridge that gulf. We are told that he 'longed to fill himself from the scraps that fell from the rich man's table.' If he had managed to eat those scraps, that would have formed some connection between himself and the rich man. However, even that minimal level of connection had denied him because of the rich man's indifference and self-absorption. Lazarus was reaching out in his desperation, but the rich man was unresponsive. The rich man created a great chasm between himself and Lazarus, and when he finally longed to bridge that gulf in the next life, it was too late.

It is not surprising then that at the core of Jesus' mission was the bridging of chasms between people. He lived and died to bring together those who, traditionally, had lived separated from each other, Jews and Samaritans, Jews, and pagans, the able-bodied and the disabled, the good and the sinner, the rich and the poor, the powerful and the disempowered. This was dangerous work at the time, and it cost him his life. The bridging of all those gulfs was the mission he entrusted to his followers, to us who are gathered here as Christians. The risen Lord wants to continue his work of ending these great gulfs through all of us in our call to discipleship.

We can sometimes feel helpless before the enormity of the gulfs that exist between individuals, communities and even in our nation today. We feel there is nothing we can possibly do to bridge those gulfs. Yet, the parable in today's gospel suggests that there is always something we can do to bridge distance between people, even if what we do is on an exceedingly small scale. If the rich man had satisfied the modest longing of Lazarus, it would not have fundamentally changed the great inequalities between the very rich and the very poor in the society of Jesus.

However, it would have been a step in the right direction. One human being's life would have changed for the better. The kingdom of heaven would have drawn nearer for one son of Abraham. Certainly, in Jesus' eyes, that would have been no small thing. There is always something each of us can do to bring the kingdom of God nearer for someone, a gulf we can cross to engage with someone in a way that enhances that person's well-being. The parable strongly suggests that the individual is all important.

The small acts of kindness for any one person are of immense value in God's eyes. On one occasion Jesus said to his disciples, 'whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward'. A cup of water is nothing, at one level, and, yet Jesus is saying that the giving of it has eternal significance. The small act of kindness done for one person can bring heaven nearer for that person and for us. The parable suggests that the doing of a little, when it is without our power to do it, is infinitely better than doing nothing.
