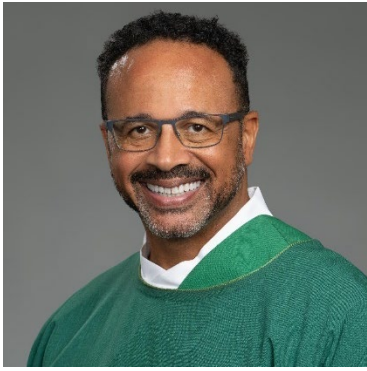

It's Never Too Late

Happy Sunday! Imagine being hired to work outside from 6:00 in the morning until 6:00 in the evening. Twelve hours...not in an air-conditioned office, but outside in the Houston heat and humidity. By noon your clothes are soaked. You're tired, hot and counting the hours until the workday ends. Then at 3:00 in the afternoon, the boss hires another group of workers. They arrive fresh and work only three hours. At 6:00, everyone lines up to be paid. The workers who arrived at 3:00 receive \$300. If you're one of the workers who started at 6:00 that morning, you're probably doing the math. If they receive \$300 for three hours, surely, you're going to receive much more for working twelve. Then the boss hands you your pay - \$300. How would you feel?

That's not fair!

That's the tension Jesus creates in today's Gospel. The laborers who worked all day complain because those who arrived later received the same daily wage. But Jesus isn't really teaching us about employment practices. He is teaching us about **grace**. The landowner represents God. The vineyard represents the Kingdom. And the daily wage points us toward God's ultimate gift, eternal life. The message is simple: **It's never too late**.

Some people have walked faithfully with Jesus throughout their lives. Others wander away and return years later. Some may not truly turn toward God until the final chapters of their lives. And God's mercy is available to all of them. That can challenge our human sense of fairness. We naturally think the person who has "worked" longer should receive more. But salvation isn't a paycheck.

Heaven isn't something God owes us because we worked enough hours. Heaven is a gift.

Today's first reading reminds us that God's thoughts are not our thoughts, and God's ways are not our

ways. Our way says, "They don't deserve it." God's mercy reminds us that neither do we.

Our way keeps score.

God keeps the door open.

But there is an important warning in this Gospel.

"It's never too late" does **not** mean we should wait.

In the homily I preached on this Gospel years ago, I said there is a problem with planning an "11th-hour conversion": **sometimes death arrives at 10:30**.

None of us knows how much time we have...

- So, if we need to return to Jesus, the time is now.
- If we need God's forgiveness, the time is now.
- If we need to forgive someone else, the time is now.
- If prayer has disappeared from our lives, the time is now.
- If we've wandered away from the Church, the time is now.

And rather than worrying about whether somebody else deserves God's mercy, we should thank God that His mercy is generous enough for **them and for us**.

If I make it to Heaven, I won't be worried about who arrived before me or who slipped in at the last minute.

I'll simply be grateful that God called my name.

Someone in your life may believe they've been away from God too long. They may believe they've made too many mistakes or committed too many sins to come home.

Today's Gospel gives us a message worth sharing with them:

Come on in.

There is still room in the vineyard.

There is still mercy.

There is still grace.

There is still time to come home.

Because with Jesus...**it's never too late**.
