Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted commentaries and homilies

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (Cycle A)

It is only natural that we try to protect those we care about from suffering. Sometimes we would rather suffer ourselves than have those we are close to suffer. This is certainly true of parents in relation to their children. They would sacrifice themselves to protect their children. We all have that instinct to protect those we have strong feelings for, those who mean a great deal to us.

In the gospel reading, Jesus speaks about the suffering that awaited him in Jerusalem that would lead to his death. Peter reacted very strongly to what Jesus said. He rebuked Jesus for saying such a thing, 'this must never happen to you.' He did not want to think of Jesus as exposed to so much suffering. Peter had confessed Jesus to be the Christ, the Son of the living God. Surely, such a person in whom God was powerfully at work could not suffer at the hands of the religious leaders and be put to death. Yet, if Peter reacted strongly to what Jesus said, Jesus reacted even more strongly to what Peter said, 'Get behind me Satan, you are an obstacle in my path.'

Jesus had just declared Peter to be the rock on which he would build his church. Now Jesus addresses him as Satan. The foundation stone had become a stumbling stone. Jesus saw Peter's protective attitude towards him as a temptation, like Satan's temptations in the wilderness, when Jesus began his ministry. On both occasions, Jesus was being tempted to preserve himself at all costs, even if it meant being untrue to his calling from God. This was a very real temptation for Jesus, which is why he reacted to it with such force.

Our instinct for self-preservation is extraordinarily strong in all of us. It is a very healthy instinct. It prevents us from carelessly exposing ourselves to unnecessary danger. This instinct is not fully developed in very young children, which is why parents must be on the lookout for them. Yet, there are times when, as adults, we need to take the more difficult and vulnerable path. It is not that we chose the difficult path because it is difficult, but because it is the path that is true to what is best in ourselves. It is the path that allows us to be faithful to our values. As followers of the Lord, we try to value what Christ values. Living in tune with his daily calling will sometimes mean dying to the self-preservation instinct, to live more fully for him and for others.

Jesus was very aware that if he were to be faithful to his Father's call to proclaim the gospel, it would lead to the way of the cross, the way of rejection, suffering, and death. Given how the world was organized, there was no other possibility. For someone like Peter to appeal to Jesus' self preservation instinct was to do the work of Satan. Having resisted the temptation of Peter in such strong terms, Jesus at once made a connection between his own situation and that of his followers, including Peter. 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let them renounce themselves, take up their cross, and follow me.' This is one of the more challenging sayings of Jesus in the gospels. He is saying you accept the hardship, rejection, or sacrifice that comes with being a faithful follower. It is a saying of Jesus that has sometimes been misunderstood.

The call to take up our cross has sometimes been heard as a call to passively accept whatever suffering comes our way. Yet, Jesus could not have meant that. He was fiercely critical of those, like the Pharisees whose attitudes and behavior brought suffering down upon others, especially on the weak and powerless. He insisted that those who had the resources should relieve the sufferings of others, feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, housing the homeless. His call to take up our cross is a call to be faithful to his way of life, even if it means painful conflict and great loss. He assures us in that gospel reading that any loss we may experience in our struggle to be faithful to his call will be small in comparison to the gain we will receive. 'Anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.'

This morning's second reading suggests that Saint Paul was of one mind with Jesus in this matter. He calls on the church in Rome 'to offer ourselves as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. To allow your behavior to change, conformed by a renewal of your "new mind." He understood that if we try to live out of our 'new mind,' the mind of Christ, it will often bring us into conflict with the behavior of the world around us, and this will sometimes entail the way of the cross. Jesus said to Peter, 'the way you think is not God's way but the way of the world.' Peter had to learn to grow into the mind of Christ. Our own baptismal calling is to keep growing into the mind of Christ. Discerning what is good and pleasing and perfect in his eyes.

Faith, Family, and a Fresh Start

When a longtime daycare worker lost her job because of declining enrollment, she never lost her faith. For two years, her children helped her pay her mortgage and utility bills while she learned to stretch every dollar. To reduce expenses, she spent evenings sitting outside to avoid using lights and air conditioning and often spent time at her daughter's home to keep costs down.

Eventually, her family began facing financial challenges of their own and could no longer provide the same level of support. "God is going to help me find a way," Delores Glover said. "I have faith."

When she was referred to the St. Francis Xavier St. Vincent de Paul Conference, she asked for help with her utility bills while continuing to thank God for all that she still had. Just a few days later, the phone rang. Her former employer was calling her back to work.

SFX Vincentians were able to provide assistance with past-due utilities, giving her the breathing room she needed as she prepared to return to the workforce.

This is the mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul: walking with our neighbors during difficult times, offering hope when it is needed most, and reminding them that they are not alone. As our community continues to change, we urgently need bilingual and Spanish-speaking volunteers to help us serve an increasing number of Hispanic neighbors seeking assistance.
