

Some reflections inspired by online copyrighted commentaries and homilies



The Epiphany of the Lord (Cycle A)

In the first reading the prophet Isaiah encourages us: "Arise! Shine, for your light has come, the glory of the LORD has dawned upon you." (Is 60:1). The light the prophet has seen is the star, which the Three Wise Men see in the East, like many other men. The Magi discover its meaning. Others consider it as something admirable, but that does not affect them. And, so, they do not react. The Three Wise Men realize the fact that, with the star, God is sending them an important message for which it is worthwhile leaving comfort and safety to take on the risks of an uncertain journey: the hope of finding the King leads them to follow the star, which the prophets had spoken of and which the people of Israel had been waiting for centuries.

They arrive in Jerusalem, the capital city of the Jews. They are sure that there they will be shown where the King has been born. Indeed, they will be told: "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet" (Mt 2:5). The news of the arrival of the Magi and their inquiry spreads around Jerusalem in a very short time: Jerusalem was, at that time, a small city and the presence of the Magi with their escort must have been noticed by all its inhabitants, thus "When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him" (Mt 2:3), the Gospel tells us.

Jesus Christ crosses the paths of the lives of many people who are not interested in Him. A little effort would have changed their lives; they would have found the King of Joy and Peace. This requires a willingness to look for Him, to move around, to ask without losing heart —like the Three Wise Men—to leave our comfort, our routine. It requires an effort to appreciate the immense value of finding Christ. If we do not find Him, we have not found anything in life, because only He is the Savior: finding Jesus is to find the Path that leads us to know the Truth that gives us Life. And without Him, nothing is worthwhile.

There came a point on the journey of the wise men when they needed more than the signs of nature to find the child whom they were seeking. When they came to Jerusalem

they had to ask, 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' To make the last short step on their long journey, they needed more than the light of a star. They needed the light of the Scriptures. The chief priests and the scribes who knew the Scriptures were able to point them in the direction of Bethlehem.

On our own journey towards the Lord, we too need the light of the Scriptures as well as the light of nature. The Scriptures are a fuller revelation of God than the natural world. It is in and through the Scriptures that we meet God and his Son in a unique way. Through the Scriptures God speaks to us in a privileged way. He asks us to listen and to allow our lives to be shaped by what we hear. The wise men allowed themselves to be guided by the Scriptures, as well as by the star. They showed something of that responsiveness to God's word to which we are all called. Our ultimate destiny, in the words of Paul's, letter to the Romans, is to be 'conformed to the image of God's Son.' Along the way, like the wise men, we too will have our brush with evil in one form or another, but evil need not stop us in our tracks, because, in the words of the prophet Isaiah, we know that our light has come, and glory shines upon us just like the star the kings follow to Bethlehem. Like the wise men's journey, our journey too will end with worship, the worship of the Trinity in heaven, the eternal offering of ourselves to God. Every experience of worship in this life is an anticipation of that final goal. As the wise men offered their gifts to the Lord, at our Eucharistic worship we offer God the gift of our lives, we enter into Christ's offering of himself.

Having made that offering, we too, like the wise men, will be prompted to leave the Eucharist and return by a different way, a way that conforms more fully to the way of Christ. This is the way, the way of Christ, that will eventually lead us to the final goal of receiving God's grace, that he gives through the gift of Christ Jesus. St. Paul, in today's second reading we are coheirs, partners in this divine plan God has revealed for all generations through the gospels.


