Yes Lord, I Accept Your Invitation

Happy Sunday! Do we believe the Good News we hear week after week from our scriptures readings in Mass? On this 28th Sunday in Ordinary time, we continue to walk through the Gospel of Matthew. Sometimes it sounds harsh. Sometimes it sounds too good to be true. When the Good News tells us over and over again how much God loves us, we may find it a little too much. Can God really love me that way? If we wonder about that then our Gospel today will really be exciting. It's about the greatest invitation we will ever receive.

We are honored by invitations, aren't we? We feel honored to be invited to the wedding or birthday of a friend. On a bigger scale, how would you feel if you were invited to a state dinner at the White House? Suppose you were in Rome and part of an audience with the Holy Father. How would you feel if the Pope pulled you aside and said, "Please join me for dinner tonight." Would you accept immediately, wholeheartedly or would you say, "Thank you, your Holiness, but I already have other dinner plans." Today's Gospel is about an invitation much greater than any of these.

Brothers and sisters let's look at the literal meaning of the Gospel. The king is God. The wedding banquet is heaven. God first invited his chosen people, the Israelites. Some refused, some were too busy. Then God opened the banquet to everyone. He went to the main roads and invited everyone he found.

Now let's apply this Gospel to ourselves. It means God is inviting us to heaven. His invitation is just as real as going to your mailbox and finding an envelope addressed to you. You open it and read, "I respectfully invite you to heaven. I request your presence with me forever. Please RSVP." Signed, God.


Does this seem too good to be true? Do we ever say to ourselves, "I just hope God closes his eyes and let me slip into heaven." If we feel this way, we are saying that God does not really want us in heaven. If we get there it will be through the back door, like an uninvited guest crashing the party. But today Jesus is saying, "No, you are the invited guest. God really wants you there."

Do we wrestle a little with this? Do we feel like double-checking the name on the envelope in our mailbox? Do we feel that we don't deserve this? Well, you're right. None of us deserve our invitation. None of us deserve the suffering and death of Jesus. But when Jesus died, the invitation list to heaven was completed and it includes your name and mine.

Brothers and sisters, again, sometimes it can be very demanding, perhaps even upsetting. Sometimes it seems too good to be true. But I didn't write the Gospel, Matthew did. It is not my parable; it is from Jesus Himself. This is Gospel truth.

How will we respond? Will we ignore the invitation like some did? Will we be too busy with other things to take it seriously? No. We will respond with a wholehearted, "Yes. Yes, Lord, I won't let anything get in the way. Yes Lord, count me in. I will be there." And you know what? They day we believe the invitation is ours, they day we respond with our whole heart, will be the day we live as people on their way to heaven.
