

Early on the first day of the week ... Mary Mazdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb.

John 20:1, NRSV

Every Easter Sunday, we hear from three saints who bear witness to Christ's resurrection: Peter, Paul, and John. Peter testifies to Jesus' life and mission, Paul to the effect that his rising has on us, and John gives an account of what happened on that first Easter morn. AROUND THE ARCHDIOCESE

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

These modifications are to be followed until further notice:

- The public celebration of all weekday and Sunday Masses will be suspended in the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston effective March 18, 2020. Churches are to remain open for individual and private prayer observing their normal hours, as discerned by the Pastors.
- Parishes, to the extent they are able, are to inform parishioners of the opportunity to view Masses either through network television or other live stream options over the internet.
- Sunday is still the Lord's Day. Families should gather to pray, read scripture, recite the Rosary. and reflect together on their faith
- The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is to be postponed, unless there is danger of death.
- Funerals may take place only in the form of "The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation" (also known as the "graveside"). A memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

Did you know that Catholics can make an Act of Spiritual Communion?

long Tt has been Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshiping Him in His Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily. When unable to receive Holy Communion, pray the prayer below:

A Prayer for Spiritual Communion My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, Come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there And unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

Like today, many of us have our hope for a better world crushed. Yet, it is in the midst of this situation that God restored to us the Savior we thought defeated and conquered. He appeared to his Apostles and later to many believers. They saw that he is alive and witnessed to it. So, I wish us all a happy Easter in the midst of the lock-down or stay-home, not because of our miseries, but because happiness is here. Jesus who overcame death has heard our prayers. The Resurrection tells us that the promise of peace and happiness is real and so I **Happy Easter!** believe.

God Is Able

My Brothers and Sisters-in-Christ, Happy Sunday! Happy Easter Sunday!

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad. The Lord is risen! We have been redeemed.

Have you wondered what life will be like when we emerge from the other side of this coronavirus cycle? Will things go back to the way they were before? Or will it be different and new?

Will we have shifted our focus and priorities from worldly things like sports, entertainment, restaurants, clubs, and bars? Will we have a greater focus on our faith and loving others?

Will we have shifted our worry from our outer beauty; getting haircuts, going to the beauty shop, getting manicures & pedicures, and facials to a greater focus on our inner beauty and focus on serving others?

Which one is better? Focusing on the 'world' priorities or focusing on God and others?

Will we have a greater love for the Church and a deeper appreciation for the Eucharist?

I certainly hope so.

St Paul says in the second reading today (in the Easter Sunday readings, Colossians 3:2) to "Think of what is above, not what is on earth."

Maybe this pandemic gives us some space to contemplate what is important in our life and central to our faith...our relationship with God.

For some of us, this may be difficult. It may be difficult for us to have hope and foresee on the other side of this pandemic as it is affecting us all right now. Many of us have a loved one, relative, or friend who has been impacted.

As I write this reflection, I am thinking of my fraternity brother's wife who is, right now, in ICU (in Houston) with the coronavirus. I also think of my wife, a nurse, who is at work tonight at the hospital. She found out today that one of the nurses, in her ward, tested positive for the coronavirus. When she gets home in the morning, she'll have to self-quarantine for fourteen days. She'll have to wear a mask and gloves while in the house.

Life for us, as we know it, will be different...

Brothers and sisters, the Good News is, on this Resurrection Sunday, that no matter how difficult the path ahead, we have our risen Lord and Savior on this journey with us. God does not forget nor forsake us, and the darkest hour is just before dawn.

The Gospel reading says that "it was still dark" when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning. I imagine that, when Mary arrived at the

tomb, she was still grieving over the loss of Jesus at His crucifixion. I imagine she wondered what life would be like after the death of Jesus. Nevertheless, she kept her faith.

There come some moments in life when faith is all we have to hold our life together. When the odds are against us and the prognosis doesn't look good and we don't have anyone we can call on...we reach a point in life where the only thing that keeps us sane...is if we have that faith.

We have faith in our resurrected Christ. We have faith that no matter what the adversity, God is still able to make a way out of no way. Some of us might have lost our job due to the coronavirus and downturn in the economy. Let us have that faith that God will hear our prayer and will make a way.

The resurrection of Jesus puts some substance behind our belief. The resurrection of Jesus gives evidence of why we believe what we believe. This is the foundation of our faith. The rising of Christ from the dead

triggers three words in our mind: God is able!

No matter what we face, God is able

No matter how dark the night, God is able

No matter how long it's been, God is able

No matter how bad it feels, God is able

No matter who said it couldn't be, God is able

Our faith is not in vain. If God raised Jesus from the dead, surely, he is able to make all things work together for our good (Romans 8:28). Surely, he can go exceedingly and abundantly above all that we could ask.

Because Christ is risen, we have nothing of which to be afraid. Because he lives, there 'ain't' nothing that ought to scare us. St Paul says that the resurrection of Christ proves that death has been defeated (1 Corinthians:15). Christ has dominion over death. And because of this, we should have joy and hope. We should have joy and hope because we have the grace to have our sins forgiven and a chance for salvation.

So, let us reflect on the sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for us and rejoice in the triumph of His resurrection. This Easter season reminds us that God is always with us and that **God is able**, in suffering and in celebration.

Let us give thanks for the many blessings in our lives and renew our focus and commitment to follow Christ's example by loving God and loving our neighbors as ourselves.
