

WE NEED PERSISTENT FAITH TODAY

Happy Sunday! Today's Gospel about the Canaanite woman gives me hope. Her persistent faith gives me hope because she was in a helpless situation with her daughter and put her full trust in Jesus that He was the answer. We need the Canaanite woman's kind of faith in our world today. I am sure that all of you would agree that we all need her faith and we need prayer today for the things that are happening in our nation and in our world. Today we fear the spread of infectious diseases. We fear climate change. We fear the condition of our economy. We are frustrated with racial inequality. Some people are turning to violence. They are turning to violence instead of turning to God.

The Gospel today teaches us to pray always and not to lose heart. It is about being tenacious in prayer, continuing to call upon the Lord even when the results are discouraging. It is also about the Lord's will to extend the Gospel to all the nations, whether it's Jews or foreigners.

So we read in Matthew, "And behold, a Canaanite woman of that district came and called out, "Have pity on me, Lord, Son of David! My daughter is tormented by a demon." Now the Canaanites were despised by Jews and Jews were despised by Canaanites. Their hatred for each other went back over a thousand years. The Jews felt that the Canaanites were a sinful race that embodied all that is evil and godless. The Jews even referred to them as

So...what is it that would make a Canaanite woman reach out to a Jewish Messiah? Desperation. She no longer cares who helps her daughter as long as someone helps her!

- How many of us feel desperate about our Nation today?
- Some of us may feel desperate, like the Canaanite woman, about a family member today. We may have a son or daughter or relative who has strayed away from God
- Some of us may feel desperate about trouble with our spouse.
- Some of us may feel desperate about our finances and making ends meet.
- Some of us may feel desperate about some bad news we received about our health.

And we've turned to God and he seems not to answer our prayers. Brothers and sisters know this...God is aware, and he is in control. Even though we may not understand, He wants us to have faith and recognize his power.

The Canaanite woman, even though her people were adversaries of the Jews, had likely heard of Jesus' power to save and heal. In turning to Jesus, she looked past their racial divide and, risking terrible rebuke, called on Him. It is her torment that enabled her to cross the boundaries. The only enemy she cared about was the demon afflicting her daughter. But when she came to Jesus, His initial reaction did not appear to be the compassionate Jesus that we know he is. He was at first silent, then he snubbed her for being a foreigner and likened her to a dog.

The scripture says, But Jesus did not say a word in answer to her. Jesus' disciples came and asked him, "Send her away, for she keeps calling out after us." He said in reply, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." ... "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." Brothers and sisters, it is a very strange to hear such a thing from the mouth of the Lord, who had already journeyed among the Samaritans and Gentiles, healing them and often praising their faith. So you may wonder, why would Jesus do this?

I believe it was because he was testing her. Jesus knows she will grow by the test. Through this test, Jesus increased the woman's faith. Jesus tested her like God tested others in Scripture. Remember... God tested Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Job, and many others.

We are tested as well. And sometimes, God seems to be strangely silent. When we send up our prayers to God, in the form of a request, we sometimes grow impatient when our prayers aren't answered immediately. Sometimes we will think, this is too many times I have asked God for > no matter how much hostility she something specific and it hasn't happened. So we lose heart.

We all want change to happen in our lives, but too often we want it now...not later. When it doesn't happen that way, we are tempted to ask, "When, God, when?" And many of us need to grow in the area of being patient and trusting God instead of focusing on the "when" question. Though God may seem silent, He is working His purposes out and seeking to increase our

When I was young, I grew up in a Baptist church and they used to say all of the time, 'God may not come when you want him, but he's always right on time'. Those of you who are parents should understand this. What parent among you has not had to do the same for your child? For example,

what if your children are untested and untried? What if they get their every wish and they never have to wait? What happens? They become spoiled, selfcentered, and are headed for ruin... You don't want this for your children and God doesn't want this for us. God knows exactly what He is doing. Again, God is aware, and he is in control.

What the Canaanite woman shows us is that we need to be persistent in our faith and persistent in our prayer. We see that the woman is not put off. Whatever anger, grief, or discouragement she may feel, she perseveres. She trusts that the Lord will make a way. She will not take no for an answer.


- ➤ She is like the widow and the unjust judge; who never stopped pestering the judge until she received a favorable
- ➤ She is like the blind man at the side of the road who kept calling for Jesus despite the rebuke of the crowds.
- ➤ She is like Zacchaeus, who overcame his short stature by climbing a tree to see Jesus.
- > She is like the widow with the hemorrhage, who, though weak and ritually unclean, pressed through the crowd and grabbed the hem of Jesus'

Brothers and sisters, the Canaanite woman withstood the test of Jesus and persisted. She held out until the change, which was the healing she desired for her daughter, was accomplished. She did not give up nor let go of Jesus...

- > no matter how unwilling He seemed
- > no matter how politically incorrect her request appeared
- encountered from the disciples, the crowds, or even Jesus Himself.

She held out. She stayed turned toward Jesus. **How about you?** Will we give way during the test or hold out until our change comes? Will our faith grow or wither? Will our love grow stronger or will it change to resentment? The woman had the victory. Jesus said to her, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And the woman's daughter was healed **from that hour.** She went from desperation to triumph by her tenacious

and tested faith. I pray that we all can have her faith. Our world needs it today. God will answer our prayers in His time. And what he will give us, will be better than that we ask. He'll give us exactly what we Deacon Darryl Drenon

- 3. To provide the time and space needed for reflection and processing, sharing and community-building, amplifying strengths and discovering solutions.




- 1. Workshop is held virtually via Zoom. Participants may log on to their zoom accounts using a phone or computer.
