

Stewardship Reflection

That Jesus is our first option and not our last resort when faced with difficult circumstances. "Jesus said to them, 'There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves'." Matthew 14:16 This is what Jesus said right before he fed the five thousand men. How often do we really place our trust in Jesus when the situation looks grim? With Jesus, no gift is too small or insignificant when offered with love. But, we have to do our part. We should trust that Jesus will provide all that we need. We need to believe that Jesus has a better plan in store for us.

### Lessons from a miracle

Romans 15:4 says: "For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide--we might have hope." Another translation says that events in the Scripture "[were] written for our instruction". Still another translation says that Scriptural accounts "were written for our learning".

The feeding of the five thousand is not just another miracle that Jesus performed. It was recorded in the Scriptures for our "learning" and for our "instruction". What lessons can we learn? It's interesting to note that this miracle is found in all four Gospels. Some of Jesus' miracles were written in just one or two of the Gospels, but the feeding of the five thousand is recorded in Matthew 14:13-21, Mark 6:31-44, Luke 9:12-17 and John 6:1-14. What is the Holy Spirit trying to teach us? What is so important about this miracle-that it is referenced by each of the Gospel writers?

I will use Matthew's account of the miracle--to extract three lessons. This is **not**--by any means--an exhaustive list of lessons taught by this miracle. Matthew 14:21, indicates that there were five thousand men, not counting the women and children. Biblical scholars believed that at least ten to fifteen thousand people were present.

Jesus wanted His disciples to feed the people. They told Him, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." John 6:8 says the loaves and fish actually came from a lad that was with the multitude. It's ironic that the one who wasn't even counted, was the one who helped with the miracle. Lesson # 1: Your blessing, your miracle, your answer to prayer, may come from the hands of someone you didn't even count as important! Your answer to prayer, may come from the hands of a person you thought worthless. Why does God operate this way? So you can be humbled by the experience. My Mother tells the story of how her father abandoned the family when she was a little girl. Many years later, I witnessed my Mom take food to her Father (my Grandfather) because he didn't have anything to eat. God may feed you by the hands of someone you thought had no value-earlier.

Matthew 14:19 says: "He [Jesus]ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass." Lesson # 2: Before you can truly experience the blessings from heaven, God must first call your life into order. Jesus brought order to the crowd [by having them to sit] then He performed the miracle. You have to get yourself structured in order to receive the magnitude of what God has for you. As a young man, I couldn't experience the blessings of God, because my spending and buying habits were out of control. Someone spoke into my life and introduced the Biblical principle of "tithing" to me. It brought discipline in my life, and now I can truly experience God's blessings.

Matthew 14:19 continues by saying: "He [Jesus] said the blessing, broke the loaves..." Lesson # 3: Learn to be thankful to God--even when it is not enough. Jesus thanked God for what He already had (5 loaves and two fish); even though the loaves and fish were not nearly enough to feed the multitude. Your rent maybe \$1,000 a month. This month you have \$800 for rent. Don't complain about the \$200 you are lacking; thank God for the \$800 you already have. Before God gives you more, you must thank Him for what you have now!
