




Stewardship Reflection



PREPARE NOW TO VOTE



If you are 65 years old or older, or have a disability, you should have

received a Mail-Ballot Request Form. All you have to do is mail in the form and you'll get your General Election ballot mailed to you. You can cast your vote for President, U.S. Senate, and other candidates without leaving your home. Your personal information and your vote will always be secret. Your ballot is anonymous, and no one will know how you vote. **NEW FOR 2020:** You now have the option of personally taking your ballot to the Clerk's office.



WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM?

The New Testament has many sections that emphasize the preeminent position of Peter among the apostles. For example, Peter's position of leadership is clearly spelled out in John 21:15-19 where after his resurrection Jesus asked Peter to "Feed my Lambs, feed my sheep". Today's gospel also emphasizes Peter's importance among the apostles and underlines our belief that after Christ, the Pope is the chief shepherd and head of the Church. Peter's character vis-a-vis the leadership position entrusted to him by Jesus indicates that the Church's leaders do not always have to perfectly represent Christ but speaking from the position of authority, the Pope has the final word. The story of passing on the Keys by Jesus to Peter was recorded by Matthew about thirty (30) years after the death of Peter. The reason Mathew recorded this story in his gospel was not to show any favoritism Jesus had for Peter, but because the leadership position of Peter would remain as part of the structure of the community of believers in Christ

Instead of reflecting on the structure of the Church, I invite us this week to ponder on the question that Jesus posed to the apostles and offer our own personal answer. How we answer the question determines our individual relationship with Jesus.

There was this young man who grew up poor. After grade school, he moved to be with family in the city. He joined a Church and was helpful, serving in various ministries in the Church. After earning the trust of the Church leadership, he was sent back to his village to begin an orphanage and vocational programs. The young man came home, took family land, promising to compensate his family and started building. After a while people began to trust and invested their hope in him. He would feed and pay those who came to worship with him. He exerted power. Pride as well as pomposity manifested itself in his life. It came to the point where he had but little to do with those in his program or village. Even water for drinking and bathing for him and his family were brought in from the city. He exploited the church and the village to make himself exorbitantly rich. With power and fame, he got himself involved in illegally getting travelling visas for those who could afford. Then, one day leaders form his Church Ministry and the government paid him an unannounced visit. He lost everything and being on the run died a pauper's death.

700 years before Christ, Shebna in our first reading was a powerful person during the reign of King Hezekiah in Judah. He rose to become next to the King, like vice-president. Power went into his head and he used his position to exploit the poor and the innocent to make himself rich. To him, the Prophet Isaiah was sent. His power was taken away from him and he lost it all.

Much as the story of Shebna and the gospel reading is connected by the symbol of authority i.e. Keys of the House of David and Heaven, they also reflect on the individual's response to the question of "who do you say that I am?"

Yes, Shebna was not directly asked that question but how he dealt with power invested in him by God dictated his behavior to the gifts God gave to him. Some of us look at Jesus as being too human to be God's Son and liking him to Elijah who also worked miracles and raised the dead (the widow's son). Some take a more objective approach to the question and liking Jesus to other prophets who called for conversion and taught with creative clarity that engaged the crowds. For such people Jesus is a motivational and holy teacher. He had a close relationship with God, but not divine.

If we answer that Jesus is a savior, or a messiah or Son of God, and even make reference to the Creed every time we profess it at Mass or say the Rosary, then how do our minds and hearts connect with Paul in our second reading from his Roman letter (Rom 11:33-36). The Prophets and apostles could tell us about God and Jesus and that is good. But we are asked to move beyond what others say to knowing Jesus on a personal level. This is the level that Jesus could say to us that it has not come from "flesh and blood, but by the heavenly father". To answer this question, we have to follow Peter's lead and spend time with God and with Jesus in prayer.

- Must commit to completing the technical assistance component of this program provided via Program Administrator.
- Local chambers of commerce operating within the city limits of Houston are eligible to apply.
