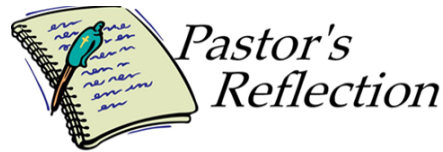

Mary teaches us to live with joy for all we have been given. Just as the moon reflects the light of the sun, Mary reflects the light of Christ. Like Mary, we are called to reflect Christ's light to the world through our gratitude and generosity.



Salvation History, A Panoramic View

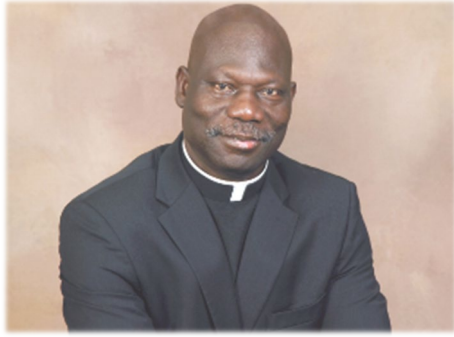
Most of the movies begin with a broad overview of the surrounding area and then zooms in gradually to the place before focusing on the characters. This method is remarkably interesting and is beautifully articulated in the story of our salvation history. The beginning of the Letter to the Hebrews (Hebrews 1:1-4) gives us the summary of this history. We can see the scene and hear music beautifully being introduced; from one view to another as the zooming narrows to a focal point when the main character is introduced. As the biblical google map begins to move from space to earth; and also runs over the sea through the land, it begins to show the Mediterranean Sea. Then from the Middle East it makes a brief stop before passing over Jerusalem to a village between two lakes connected by a river. The village is not even on the shores of the river but away from it. There in the middle of nowhere, God's angel lands to address a young woman. She was a societal nobody and yet the angel asked her to agree to God's plan to change human history. To listen to and contemplate on this mystery of Christ's birth, we must listen carefully and attentively with open heart. Attentive listening is the only way to bring about a change of heart as we internalize this love story of God.

Our panoramic view of the salvation history has been narrowed down and this is a cause for us to pause and reflect this last Sunday of Advent on the story of King David. King David, the shepherd king is enjoying peace and tranquility in the most luxurious type of house and amenities available to him. His kingdom is now well established and prosperous. To him, this is an affirmation of God. As he takes stock of his life and acknowledges God as the source of his successes, he decides to build a house for God. This Temple is where he would keep the ten (10) Commandments. Even though this intention has been approved by the Prophet Nathan, yet God forbade him to build the Temple. God's desire was rather to dwell among his people and be with them. God will be a father to them through the one who would be chosen by Him. God may have known that focus on the temple, could blind the people or make David get lost on his ego trip. So, God asked Nathan to tell David **"no"** to the building idea. However, God not only made a promise to David that He would make him famous but also give him an heir whose kingdom would endure forever.

The panoramic view now shifts to a village town of Nazareth. There the Angel Gabriel encountered a young woman engaged to be married. She allowed the word from the Angel to direct and change her life. Luke situates this encounter in the context of God's time. The God who did not want David to build a temple has passed the Temple and the Holy City of Jerusalem for a home in Nazareth. The reason for this is inferred from Deuteronomy 7:7 where God said he chose Israel not for its greatness but because God loved little Israel and called her from the days of Abraham. God has accompanied her everywhere, from when she acknowledged and did not know Him.

This God of Abraham revealed himself to a maiden engaged to be married. The choice of Mary reminds us of how impressed God is to those who are humble of heart. David the great king wanted to build a temple for God and God said **"no"**. Then God came to a humble maiden and asked her for a home, and she said **"yes"**. David thought he knew what being great was, but the angel described God's kingdom as being beyond human understanding.

So, the panoramic view of God's intervention in human history is now narrowed to the small village called Nazareth, into a simple family and zoomed in on an unassumed engaged young lady called Mary. Now we can hear how God realized his promise of incarnation. It was not the temple that first housed the Son of God, rather a stable. The Son of God did not come to a family of a king or priest, but to an unnoticed humble maiden who was engaged to be married. If there is one lesson to be learnt, it is this, that God is interested in a listening heart. If we follow the panoramic view and journey with God with listening and humble heart, we will experience his gifts of Christmas. **Stay tuned!**



CHRISTMAS GREETINGS AND NEW YEAR WISHES

2020 calendar year is ending with many trials and uncertainties. Our nation has been consumed with political and social challenges. We shall then see the face of God who will “deliver us from our guilt”.

The season of Advent has given us the moment to reflect on the coming of Christ. We have been asked to look for the signs of salvation. As the Prophet Isaiah has reminded us, God is faithful and trustworthy so we can “strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak” and assure “those whose hearts are frightened: be strong and fear not” because God has come to bring us vindication and salvation (Isaiah 35: 6).

So, with love and hope we humbly celebrate the birth of the one who has come to realize the prophecies of Isaiah. Isaiah, Mary, Joseph, and Paul all tell us, with the Christmas story, not to let self-pity control our lives. It does not matter how beleaguered we are, or may feel, there is cause for rejoicing here. We know that God loves us and has enabled us to pierce through our trials and tribulations to find reason to celebrate, namely: with time our economy will bounce back, the political divide will be healed, and we now have a vaccine for the corona virus.

Therefore, it is an honor and a privilege for me to be able to join you on this spiritual journey. Your living faith is an oasis from which I draw strength. As we celebrate during the Christmas Season, I pray that we humble ourselves to experience the Love which the Incarnate Word brings. May the Christmas joy increase our faith and continue to fill us with hope. Know that your intentions will be on the Altar of Sacrifice at all the Masses during the Octave of Christmas.
