Stewardship Reflection

That the seeds God sows in our lives may take root and lead to greater prayer, participation and generosity. "The seed sown among thorns is the one who hears the word but then the cares of the world and the lure of riches choke the word and it bears no fruit." - Matthew 13:22 Does the lure of riches and material goods choke God out of your life? Are you so caught up in earthly activities that you have no time for God? Gratitude and generosity are virtues that we should strive to do on a daily basis. Every decision we make either takes us one step closer to God or one step further away. What we receive at Mass every Sunday should be shared with others all the other days of the week as well.



EVEN WHEN YOU ARE IN DOUBT, CONTINUE TO BELIEVE

I read a story from a homily by Fr. Joe Robinson in 'Guiding Light, Cycle A'. The story was of a newly ordained priest who was having a tough time getting his first sermon started. He asked for suggestions from the Pastor who responded: "start your homily with something that certainly grabs the attention of the people". The Pastor gave an example of what he meant by saying, "some of the best years in my life were spent in the arms of a woman who was not my wife". He smiled at the shocking expression on the face of the young priest and then added: "she was my mother".

Sunday came and the young priest nervously ascended the pulpit, sweating and shaking. Armed with the pastor's suggestion, he began his sermon: "Last week the pastor told me some of the best moments in his life were spent in the arms of a woman who was someone else's wife". This punch line got everyone's attention. However, the young priest was so nervous that his mind went blank. So, he concluded by saying "for the life of me, I can't remember who he said she was".

Situations in life make us question things that has happened and is happening to us. We go back into our memories and bring to present events that justify our feelings of disbeliefs and doubts. Sadly, we do not bring the good that has been the guiding force that has brought us to the present. We relish in disbeliefs and doubts and rationalize away anything else. Unfortunately, this attitude is very much alive in our world today, especially amid COVID 19 and other world challenges.

In today's First reading, the prophet's audience is the Jewish people in captivity in Babylon. Having been in captivity and slavery to the Babylonians for fifty years, the people have become content with their situation and given up hope. God's promise of return to Israel, to their cities and to their lands, through the prophet Isaiah was met with skepticism and doubt. Even though Israel had become convinced of the effectiveness of the Word of God when the prophets announced the fall of the northern and southern kingdoms, people in exile have become complacent and have fallen into disbelief. God assured them that his promise would be fulfilled. God uses the analogy of the rain and snow to let Israel know that He means what He says. He sends rain to moisten and bring life to the earth, giving food and water to all. He assures the doubters that His word is not full of empty promises. It is effective and powerful, accomplishing that for which it is sent. So, even in doubt, still believe! You can take His word to the bank and cash it. He does not delight in grudges, so those who cannot believe in God's mercy or divine intention to save, are exhorted to trust in the word of God.

Today's Gospel parable describes for us three classic obstacles to believing when in doubt. First, the evil one prevents the word from being truly heard. As Jesus himself explained: "the evil one comes and steals away what was sown in the heart". Second, the flesh is that part which makes us abandon God's will in times of struggles or tribulation because there is no anchor in our faith. The third obstacle is where the world defers to a society that is opposed to God and appeals to the flesh. For Jesus, the kingdom of God is only for those who are willing to put in the time and struggle to understand his proclamation of the kingdom of God. The Kingdom of God is not an entitlement. Just because the seed of grace has been planted in our hearts, if we do nothing with it, it will wither and die. It is only those who choose to allow the word (seed) of God to grow in them who will bear fruits. This means that we must be patient and allow the fullness of the Kingdom to become realized in and through us. God supplies the means needed to produce the extraordinary abundant harvest in our lives. So, even amid the challenges that we are facing: COVID 19, employment uncertainties, social unrests, and the bleak future, continue to believe. God's Word will realize its purpose. We can take that to the bank!
