

Prayer in Time of the Coronavirus



Anything is Possible if You Have Faith

Many of us can relate to the scene of the child whose mother/father leaves to run some errands for a short period of time. After settling down from a tantrum, the child promises not to let the parent out of his sight again. When the parent returns, the child meets the parent with joy and, holding on to their hands, resolves never to let go. There is the assurance that this will not happen again. This usually brings some degree of calmness and consolation but there is always some anxiety that lingers on.

The Gospel reading today starts with Jesus asking his disciples to have faith in him and ends with a statement that those who do so will accomplish even greater works than he (Jesus) himself had done. Faith in Jesus and the accomplishments that come with it has become the fundamental principle of the Christian community throughout its existence.

Realizing that the end was drawing near, Jesus, at the last supper, prepared his apostles for what was going to happen to him. He would be arrested, put on trial, tortured, and finally die on a cross. Before dinner, he taught them by example how they were to serve one another by washing their feet. While this was going on, they were preoccupied with positions on earth and in the kingdom of God.

It was at the Last Supper that the disciples seem to have gotten Jesus' departure message and began to react to it. Peter and the other disciples believed that they had found the messiah. They believed that the messiah is immortal, a strongman able to deliver them from their foreign occupation and usher in an everlasting kingdom of peace. No wonder when they became aware that Jesus was giving a farewell discourse, they became terrified. Their whole belief system was collapsing at the dinner table right in front of Jesus.

It is like the child who sees their parent(s) leaving without knowing where mom or dad is going. The assurance that Jesus gave did not go far enough to calm their anxiety: "do not let your hearts be troubled" (Jn 14:1). Thomas tries desperately to understand what Jesus is saying. Neither he nor any of his brothers understand what Jesus is telling them. Why would Jesus leave them?

Desperately trying to grasp what was going on, Philip asks: "Let us see the Father and we shall be satisfied" (Jn14:8). Did he get the answer he was looking for? No. But he got reassurance of "trust me!" and "believe in what I say and the works I do".

Jesus said that God is concerned about the same things we care about: the corporal works of mercy, i.e. feeding the hungry, welcoming the rejects of society, changing the outdated laws and precepts, taking care of the widows and strangers, etc.

When dissension came to the early Church in Jerusalem, as recorded in our 1st reading, (Acts 6:1-7) it is this same spirit of God that guided it through to an amicable solution. This faith and trust in Jesus and his works have sustained and guided the Church until this day. It is, therefore, quite refreshing and comforting, as we prepare to celebrate the Solemnities of Ascension and Pentecost, to remember that the Spirit, the Advocate, promised to his disciples, will continue to guide us through these challenging times. Jesus knew then and knows now how traumatic it would be for his followers after he was put to death and so he told them and us not to let our hearts be troubled. He not only tells us, but also gives us the means to avoid distress: "You have faith in God, have faith also in me". AMEN!


