

How Do We Know Our Shepherd's Voice?

Brothers and Sisters, Happy 4th Sunday of Easter!! I hope you all are well and are coping in these uncertain times. Today, more than ever, there is need for us to listen to what God is telling us. There is a need for us to ask the Holy Spirit to guide us, to order our steps. Can you hear His voice?

In today's Gospel, Jesus illustrates his teaching by referring to shepherds and sheep. He is the Good Shepherd, as foretold by the prophets, in the Old Testament. It is about the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep. The Lord knows each one of us by name. He relates to us in a personal way and he invites us to relate to him in a personal way.

By faith we accept Jesus and our relationship is a deeply personal one. The bond of love uniting us is based on the love that unites the Father and Jesus. Our new existence is founded on God's unbreakable love and faithfulness. So, in order to enter eternal life, we must <u>listen</u> to Jesus and obey him. We have to tune our minds to the <u>sound of his voice</u>.

But, how do we know our Shepherd's voice?

When I was young, meaning school aged, I wondered...why does God talk to others and <u>not</u> me? I was brought up Baptist. I went to Baptist Church every Sunday with my best friend Herbert because his Dad was the pastor of a Baptist Church. Every Sunday, I would hear Preachers say that they <u>heard</u> God. They would say "and the Lord told me" to do this or that. There were also people giving testimony and they said that they had heard God.

I would also hear the Old Testament stories where God spoke to people. He conversed with Adam in the garden. He told Noah to build an ark. He spoke to Moses in a burning bush. He promised Abraham a son. Paul heard His voice on the way to Damascus.

Well, I couldn't hear Him like that, and I wondered why I couldn't? It was because, at my young age, I thought that He would speak to me in an audible voice.

Have you ever wondered why YOU couldn't hear His voice? I would pray and speak to Him but would never hear Him speak back to me. It's funny though, I never thought to ask anyone why I couldn't hear God speak to me.

So, how would I know my Shepherd's voice?

Since then, through God's grace, I have come to better understand how we hear our Shepherd's voice.

He can speak to us in various ways and it doesn't necessarily have to be in an audible voice. God treats each of us as unique children and, because of that, God doesn't necessarily "speak" the same way to all of us.

Brothers and sisters, I am excited today to reflect about His voice because:

- ➤ His voice can lead us to navigate through troubled times.
- ➤ His voice can lead the worse sinner to turn his or her life around and do great things.
- ➤ His voice can stop us from committing a sin when we are about to commit one.
- ➤ His voice can lead us to say no, when the world says yes.
- ➤ His voice can lead us to Church, can lead us to confession, & can lead us to heaven.

Our Shepherd's voice can direct our lives if we give ourselves the opportunity to hear Him.

How do we know our Shepherd's voice?

Here are some ways Jesus, our Shepherd, speaks to us:

His Word - In order to actually "hear" from God, we have to know some things about God's character. We have to develop an understanding of who God is, and the way he does things. He speaks to us when we read the Bible.

2 Timothy 3:16 says that all Scripture is "God-breathed." His Word sometimes gives us a warning, a word of encouragement, or a lesson for life.

Have you ever had something on your heart and when you opened the bible and picked a passage, it spoke to that very thing that was on your heart? It has definitely happened to me.

Other People - Many times God will use other people to try to get through to us. God may use a friend, a teacher, a parent, or a preacher to convey His message of truth to us.

Our Circumstances - Sometimes the only way God can teach us something is to allow circumstances in our life to lead us to and *through* the very thing we need to discover or change. Sometimes circumstances can be painful.

The Inner Voice - Sometimes God uses a tiny voice inside of us to let us know when we're not on the right path. It's that inner something that is telling us to make a change. It's not an audible voice, but it's definitely there. Sometimes people say, "my mind told me something". I would say, that at times, that inner voice is not just your conscious, but it's the voice of our Shepherd.

Through Prayer and quiet time - God often speaks to us through His Spirit, through prayer. Prayer is a conversation with God. We get to know God through prayer. It should be two way. When we pray, then, we should also listen. We can listen when we have that quiet time with Him. We can pray and ask Him to speak to us. Then...we have to sit still to listen. Setting aside the quiet time to hear his voice is probably the most challenging in today's world. We always have some sort of noise going on. For some, there is always a TV or music on. Nowadays, its these cell phones that keep our attention. For some of our youth, it's video games. Sometimes it can be the noise of our own thoughts, our own negative self-speak that can block His voice. So, if we want to hear his voice, we have to make time for him by eliminating the noise. We have to pray and ask for God's grace to hear Him.

Brothers and Sisters, these are a few ways we can hear and **know our Shepherd's voice.**

Does God speak to all of us the same way? No, we are all unique. Are these the only ways God speaks today? No. Our Creator is a creative God. He speaks in so many ways, including through miracles, music, dreams, & visions. Regardless of the way Shepherd chooses to reveal Himself or "speak" to us today, let us remember one truth. He will never contradict His Word, and the message He gives will always bring glory to Him. Let us be aware today that He speaks to us and let us be ever conscious that He can use all things to communicate with us...to follow Him, the Good Shepherd. Be safe and may God's Grace and Blessings be in your path.
