#### Pentecost Amid COVID-19

This year the celebration of Pentecost will be unlike any other in recent memory. It will be so because of the tragic irony that we find ourselves contending with a virus whose most notable symptom is its denial of breath. This Pentecost we find ourselves longing to be filled with God's breath in a world struggling for air.

Those of us left wondering how to mark Pentecost this year amid social distancing might simply recall that in spite of our absence from public worship, the Spirit's invitation to the Church to offer fitting worship (the capacity for this being itself pure gift) persists. This is so because "Church" is not simply showing up for an hour in a building on Sunday (or maybe a few more times a week).

Rather, the Church is realized in the graced response of her members to God's summons for loving unity. The Church is most fully herself when she cooperates with the Holy Spirit to foster that unity. In this alone does she convey genuine gratitude for the gift of God's life, and in turn offers fitting worship expressive of that gratitude.

It, therefore, requires us always to turn to God in supplication, imploring his favor. And that is why once more at Pentecost we must cry out, "Come, Holy Spirit." (Father Andrew Clyne)

### "He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit"

Happy Pentecost Sunday!

Today, we celebrate the birthday of the Church. On the Pentecost, Jesus sends the Holy Spirit down into his Disciples to begin the work of the Church. He breathed on them and they received the Holy Spirit.

This Church that Christ created is often referred to as the Body of Christ. The reason it is the Body of Christ is because we, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, continue the physical work of Christ here on earth.

Last week we celebrated Christ's ascension into heaven. Christ's physical body ascended into heaven where he took His seat at the right hand of God, the Father.

So Jesus left his physical presence here on earth <u>in</u> us, His disciples, and His continued his work in the world with us as his hands and feet in the world.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit upon the disciples after his resurrection.

We see it in two of our readings today. He sends the Holy Spirit in the Gospel reading from John when, in the upper room, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit".

The Holy Spirit was sent to the Apostles in the first reading today on the feast of Pentecost. In Acts, chapter 2, it says the Apostles were gathered together in one place. Acts describe a strong, driving wind and "tongues as of fire" that rested on each of them. Then Acts goes on to say that "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."

The Spirit of our master, Jesus, rested upon the disciples and filled them with the gifts of the Spirit. And once they had the gifts of the Holy Spirit, they had the courage to go out and preach about Jesus.

It is this same Holy Spirit that is in us and can give us the courage we need as witnesses of the faith.

God loves us all and gives us gifts, no matter who we are, where we come from, or what our position is in life. We don't earn God's favor by the positions we hold, but receive it freely from the unconditional love of God for us. St Paul talks about those gifts in today's second reading when he says, "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. "He goes on to say that, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit".

This means that the <u>one</u> Holy Spirit provides us with different gifts for doing God's work in the world. God shares these gifts with us for the common good.

If these gifts are for the common good, why isn't everyone using them for the common good or the benefit of others? How many of us have the gifts that God has given us but we don't use it for his work?

Maybe it's because we let the evil one or the world stop us from using our gifts for God's glory. Maybe we worry about what the world thinks instead of what pleases God. Or maybe we are too centered on ourselves to share our gifts with others.

Or maybe we have a fear and lack the courage to let the controls go and allow the Holy Spirit to guide us.

St Paul gives us a great example of how to do God's work and allow the Holy Spirit to guide us and to give us courage. He says in Acts, chapter 20, "But now, compelled by the Spirit, I am going to Jerusalem. What will happen to me there I do not know, except that in one city after another the Holy Spirit has been warning me that imprisonment and hardships await me. Yet I consider life of no importance to me, if only I may finish my course and the ministry I received from the Lord Jesus, to bear witness to the Gospel of God's grace."

This is powerful brothers and sisters. Paul was willing to let go of the controls and allow the Holy Spirit to lead him. He made room for the Holy Spirit to dwell in him.

We are like a house and the Holy Spirit wants to dwell in us and guide us and be our advocate. But he can't if our house is cluttered.

Our clutter is our ego, desire for power, selfishness, and immoral behavior. Our clutter is our prejudice against others. Our clutter is in our judgement of others or when we gossip on others. Our clutter is when we don't put God first and when we don't love Him with all of our heart, all of our soul, and all of our mind.

If our house is filled with this clutter, the Holy Spirit has no room to come in.

It's when we remove this clutter, the Holy Spirit can order our steps, the Holy Spirit can guide us. When Jesus sent his advocate to us, the Holy Spirit, after he ascended, we became his hands and feet and an extension of him.

Brothers & sisters, when you do God's work, if you make the room in your house, the Holy Spirit will guide you. For instance, when we go visit the sick, go visit someone in prison, go minister to the poor, or go to tell others about His Good News, do we rehearse the right words to say or the right things to do? No, most of the time, we just go to love and serve that person and the Holy Spirit will guide us.

The Holy Spirit can guide us if we clean our house and go for the right reasons. The right reasons are out of love or a sincere care or concern for the other person. It's the right reason if we are going to serve them because we are serving Him. It's the right reason if we are going to love them as Jesus loved us.

The Holy Spirit intercedes on our behalf if we are out in the world doing his works of mercy.

The world needs our Christian love today. The world needs each and every one of us to be Christ to others. We are Jesus' disciples. Again, we are Jesus' hands and feet in the world. Jesus says in John's Gospel, "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

It is through our love that we can bring the world back to Christ. I pray that the Holy Spirit gives each of us the strength and guides each of us to love and serve Him and others and to follow His will.


