Our Lady of Prompt Succor (pronounced: "sucker") is a Roman Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary associated with a wooden devotional image of the Madonna and Child enshrined in New Orleans, LA. The image is closely associated with Mother Saint Michel, the Superior of the New Orleans Ursulines. A terrible fire ravaged the city in 1812, and the wind was rapidly driving it in the direction of the convent of the Ursulines. One of the nuns, Sister St. Anthony, placed a small replica of Our Lady of Prompt Succor in her window that faced the approaching fire, while Mother St. Michel prayed aloud, asking Our Lady for help. Immediately the wind changed the direction of the flames. Mary's help has been sought from the shrine ever since during the threat of hurricanes.

Stay Awake, Be Ready, For Something Wonderful Is About To Happen

The Church year has ended, and a new one has begun. The political and social atmosphere in which we are ushering this new Church year is all but exciting. There is tension in our society because the transfer of political power in the country is all but smooth. The outgoing president does not seem to be able to humble himself to accept defeat and gracefully exit. This has highlighted the political and social divide among the groups that make up our society and even our families. Even our religious leadership seems inept to guide our social and religious compasses. According to the Associate Press report published by David Cary on November 18, 2020, the Catholic leadership is divided into two groups over the abortion stance, those who support Donald Trump and those who are in favor of Joe Biden. Those who are regarded as conservatives versus the liberals. We are murmuring among ourselves and crying for someone to lead us. The moral issue of abortion has now been personalized: those who support Donald Trump, a non-practicing Christian and Joe Biden, a practicing Catholic who, because of his support of the law of the land, is disliked by some "good" Catholics. Some priests have refused Joe Biden the communion sacrament.

It is in such milieu of uncertainties and disappointments that today's scripture reading originally belonged. The Babylonians had destroyed Jerusalem and its temple in 586 BC and forced a large group of Israelites into exile. There they stayed for 50 years until the Persians conquered Babylon and permitted the captives to return to their native lands.

The return which should have been a welcoming and joyful occasion rather created a problem. Like our world today instead of joyfully preparing ourselves for the coming of Christ, anxiety and the fear of uncertainties have crippled us. With the political uncertainties, COVID-19, racial unrest, economic uncertainties, many may choose to give up. As Isaiah prophesied about the return, many Jews chose to remain in exile because those who first went to Jerusalem sent back word that all is not great at the home front. It was better to live in exile than to come home to completely rebuild the native land. They had lost hope.

If we liken what was happening in Jerusalem during the reconstruction after exile to what is happening in our country today, then we can picture, as Carol Stuhlmueller says in the New Biblical Commentary, someone standing in the middle of Jerusalem's destroyed temple praying the verses of our first reading

Some of us have resolved that the challenges of our society are not going to change and so we have to accept the status quo. Many have a deep desire to see change and a better hope for our future where all parties will work together for our common good. For us, we hear Isaiah and Jesus telling us to keep hope alive. But we must first commit ourselves to building our relationship and trust with God. This new relationship with God is the answer to our quest. We shall see the face of God who will "deliver us from our guilt". According to the prophet and Christ, we must first make a commitment to become the people of God.

Even during these uncertainties, Paul cautions us against being idle or passive. It is easy to justify why we should accept things as they are. He tells us that Jesus will hold each of us accountable. He joins the Prophet and Jesus to tell us to be watchful and be ready as we call on God to come down. Just as Isaiah's words became realized, we too will experience the good news: new life and fresh hope for a tired and anxious world. This is the period where we can pierce the dark and find hope when mere optimism is not enough. A time to interpret breakdown as breakthrough and hear bad news as a chance to show compassion. A period to accompany others as they search for God in suffering. Let us, therefore, not fall asleep but watch and pray. God will appear at any time.


