

The selections from both Isaiah and Matthew feature vineyards in poor shape. In Isaiah's case, the vineyard is prepared diligently, but ends up being overrun by wild grapes. In Matthew,

Jesus tells a parable whose vineyards is commandeered by greedy tenants who abuse and kill the landowner's representatives. Who then will produce good fruit for the kingdom? Paul encourages the Philippians to do so by continuing to do what they have learned from him. Let us learn from scriptures how we can produce good fruit.

God, the Disappointed, Yet Hopeful Gardener

With Covid-19 breathing heavily on our neck, many have not paid attention to the passing of the calendar year and our liturgical times. We have had a hot summer and a busy hurricane season. Many of our vacation plans have either been cancelled or put on hold. We are nervously opening the educational institutions. Despite everything, the year is speeding towards the end and to Christmas. Our scripture readings have begun to focus on the end of time. The parables and stories we shall read from Matthew's Gospel from now through November come from the events in the last week of Jesus' life on earth.

According to the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus comes to Jerusalem to find the Temple being defiled by money changers and people buying and selling animals for sacrifice. He drove them out and dared to teach and even heal the sick in the Temple (something which the Law prohibits). So, the Chief Priests and elders challenge his authority to do such things. Jesus answers them with three parables. The first is what we read last week about the vineyard owner and his sons. They both were asked to go and work in the vineyard. The first son said "no" but later changed his mind and went to work in the vineyard. The second son said "yes" but did not go to the vineyard at all. Jesus compared the first son to sinners who repented and reformed their lives. The second son was compared to the elders and the high priests who did not see the need to walk in the path of righteousness.

Today we hear the second parable of Jesus addressed to the high priests and the elders. Since farming was the main stay of the Jewish community, and Israel was often referred to as the Lord's vineyard, Jesus, branching off from Isaiah's song about and his friend's vineyard, uses the vineyard as the frame for his parable. In Isaiah's vineyard song, the complaint was about the grapes. They were too sour to eat or be used for wine. In Jesus parable, it is the tenants.

Some of us like to plant gardens in the spring and fall seasons. In addition to the joy and fun of gardening, we do expect good harvest from what we plant. This year I planted a vegetable garden next to the Prayer Garden with the help of some of the Church members. I rented a soil tiller and bought good vegetable plants and fertilizers. It took some days to get the ground ready for planting. The vegetables were planted and watered often. Despite the summer heat, I expected some good crops, which Thank God, I did get. How would I have felt if all that labor came to not!

With this little experience, I can imagine how much work is involved with setting up an entire vineyard as described by Isaiah and Jesus. With the imagery of a farmer working in the field, Isaiah sang the disappointing garden experience of God. He prophesied the destruction of God's vineyard (Israel) by the Assyrians, and the Babylonians because of their unfaithfulness to God. Jesus takes this Isaiah song and concentrates the problem of unfaithfulness not on the grapes (the people of Israel) but on the tenants (religious leader). The priests and elders were in charge with caring for the vineyard. They thought that the vineyard belonged to them, and so refused to recognize both the owner and his son. They also thought they could get by with their greediness. This ended up with them losing everything they had.

However, before we misinterpret the song and parables as "us versus them" and use them as a pretext for condemnation, the prophet and Jesus want to shock us into conversion. This teaching is to call us to change our ways. It is the hope of God that we will heed his calling to action before his kingdom is taken from us and given to those who will produce its fruits. Our hopeful God looks for holiness from the people with not only religious powers, but everyone entrusted with the responsibility to direct God's people. These are the people St. Paul refers to as those who live a life of prayer, thanksgiving, a life of trust in God's providence; a life of whatever is pure, honorable, just, gracious and following the teachings and example of Jesus.

Even though the Vineyard story and the parable of Jesus end on a rather tragic and evil note, God brought something good out of them. So we draw strength from our God who we often disappoint, yet he remains hopeful in us.






