

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Cycle A)

October 11, 2020

"For I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content." Philippians 4:11

Are you a Thermometer or Thermostat Christian?

The Apostle Paul is speaking to the Church in Philippi. He is teaching certain behaviors that he wanted to be pervasive through-out the Church. He says in Philippians 4, "Not that I complain of want; for I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content. I know how to live in humble circumstances; and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry of living in abundance and of being in need." Paul is trying to develop specific mind-sets in the early Church. Though this is NOT an exhaustive list, I will present three things that Paul is trying to inject into the DNA of the infant Church.

- 1. Let your life be an example of how to follow Christ. St. Paul wanted the early Christians to follow his example, as he modeled Christ. In Philippians 3:17 Paul boldly says, "Brethren, join in following my example...as you have us for a pattern." Another translation says (in the same verse) "Brethren, join in imitating me...as you have an example in us." Paul is saying, look at our lifestyles (he and the other missionaries with him); because it was a very good indicator of how to follow and live for Christ. Living for Christ was not theoretical to Paul, but practical. The greatest gift you and I can give our family is to be a good example of Christ.
- 2. Learn contentment. The Apostle Paul says "...I have learned, in whatever state I am, to be content." Phil. 4:11. Another translation says, "...I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances." The New Testament was originally written in Greek. The Greek definition of content in this verse means "sufficient in oneself" (Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words 1966). In other words, if I have little--that's sufficient or enough for me. If I have abundance--that is also sufficient or enough.



Learning contentment, is a key to avoiding grumbling and complaining about the circumstances in life. The Apostle Paul tells us in his Epistle, "Do all things without grumbling or questioning that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world." Phil. 2:14-15. Do you want to be a light for Christ? Stop complaining and shine!

3. Be consistent in your walk for Christ.

Notice the words in Phil 4, "...whatever state". Paul is saying regardless of the (outside) circumstances: hungry, fullness, poverty, riches, shelter, no-shelter, peace, turmoil-I am the same. One of the hallmarks of a mature Christian is consistency in their journey with Christ. Are you a thermometer or a thermostat Christian? Let me illustrate. Thermometers measure temperature. If it's 95 degrees, that thermometer goes up to 95 degrees. Many Christians are like thermometers. If I curse you; you curse me back. If I yell at you, you yell at me back. The higher you go, the higher I go. If I don't have this or that, I am sad. If I have abundance, then I am happy and friendly!

Other Christians are like **thermostats**; regardless of the outside environment-they are going to choose how they will behave. They realize that their behavior is a choice. They regulate themselves despite prevailing circumstances.

Let us pray. Dear Lord, help us to be good models for Christ, so others can follow You. Teach us contentment regardless of the situation. May our steps be consistent, knowing that You will fully supply whatever we need according to the glorious riches in Christ Jesus. Amen!
