If you vote by mail, use this checklist to prepare: (1) Start today! Give

yourself and your election officials ample time to complete the process. (2) Rules and dates vary by state, so contact your election board to confirm. Find links at www.usps.com/votinginfo. (3) Request your Mail-in ballot (often called "absentee" ballot) at least 15 days before Election Day. (4) Once received, follow the instructions. Add postage to the return envelope if needed. (5) We recommend you mail your ballot at least 7 days before Election Day. Also: 1. Are you 18 years old or will be 18 years old by **November 3, 2020** - Election Day? 2. Have you registered to vote? The deadline is **October 5, 2020**. If you're registered, plan to vote early. If you're not registered, get registered and plan to vote early. **October 13 - 30** - Early in-person Voting **November 3** - Election Day, 7 am - 7 pm

Pastor's Reflection

The Merciful and Generous God

Last week we talked about forgiveness. We heard from the Lord's Prayer that God forgives us to the degree to which we forgive others. Sirach warned us not to **hug tight** our wrath and anger but to **let go** so that when we pray our own sins will be forgiven. So that we will experience greater blessings, Jesus has told us to forgive as many times as our neighbor offends us.

For some of us, this demand is depressing and too difficult to fulfill. Many a time do we think that we have lost God's love because of our sinfulness or our inability to forgive.

Today's scripture readings from Isaiah give us "glad tidings". The good news is that even though we have missed out on God's blessings inherent in forgiveness, and we feel punished for our infidelity, like the Israelites who lost their land and were living in exile, God loves us too much to destroy our covenant relationship with him. In fact, God still follows us in our "sinful exile" and urges us to return to him. The prophet urges us to "seek the Lord" again. Then, with our lives reformed, we will find mercy, because the very nature of God is to be generous and forgiving. However, even though there are no limits to God's mercy, his forgiveness must be sought through repentance. As Matthew reminds us, the "*Kingdom of Heaven is at hand*" (Mt 4:17)

Jesus uses a common business practice to engage our interest as well as challenge our understanding on how God's mercy works. Under normal circumstances, the landowner sends servants to look for workers to hire and pay them at the end of the day. However, in today's Gospel reading the business model changes. The owner himself is the one who went out to look for and hire the laborers. Having agreed with the first group on the daily wage, he sent them to his farm at different hours of the day starting from 6:00 a.m. The daily wage of unskilled workers during the Roman occupation was a denarius. This amount was just enough to support a family for a day. Consequently, unskilled workers must go out daily to look for a job to feed their families.

It is at the remuneration time that the landowner showed his personality as being a just and fair person. He was also very generous and merciful. He was fair and just to those who worked all day since they were paid the agreed upon daily wage. He chose to be generous to the rest, even though they did not work the whole day, and may not have enough money to feed their family that day.

Through Isaiah, God has let us know that His ways are not our ways. That "*as high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts*" (Is. 55:9). In other words, God tempers justice with mercy. Jesus with his parable tells us that God is willing to reach out to sinners and anyone who finds it difficult to forgive. It is never too late to experience God and his forgiveness. All that is required is repentance. We are reminded of the story of the "good" thief whom Jesus forgave on the cross (Luke 23: 39-42).

Yes, humanly speaking and at the emotional level, we can argue that the landowner was unfair in his treatment of the workers who sweat the whole day. But then, unless it is out of envy, how could anyone treat his/her friend or family with support and sympathy if a person's plight is not known. In paying all the workers a day's wage, the owner of the vineyard paid not according to the work done but according to the need i.e. out of his generosity. So, we hear of the generosity of God's kingdom, in which everyone's needs are met, regardless of the person's fortune or ability. God cares more about mercy than fairness. Sometimes we feel like God has made us work all day to survive in life, and envy and anger prevents us from being full beneficiaries of God's mercy. If we are still for a moment, we will know that God has been fair to us with his blessings. We can then be grateful to God for his blessings and gifts and let go that which has blinded us. Remember: the mercy and kindness of God outweighs his justice and fairness.

Elder Abuse

Elder abuse can happen to anyone and it can take many different forms. Most cases of abuse reported to Adult Protective Services involve “self-neglect.” Many of these people are vulnerable to abuse because they live alone or are dependent on someone else for their care. Texas requires by law the reporting of elder abuse or the suspicion of elder abuse. If you know of someone who cannot care for himself/herself, or who is being abused, neglected or exploited, whether they live alone or with a spouse or caregiver, Texas law requires that you report the abuse.
