

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY




Today's Gospel features the story of "doubting Thomas," the apostle who refused to believe in the risen Christ until he saw him with his own eyes.

THE CHAPLET OF DIVINE MERCY

Our Lord gave St. Faustina a set of prayers to invoke His mercy, called the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. On standard rosary beads, pray the following prayers:

First, on the Crucifix, one Our Father, Hail Mary and the Apostles' Creed. On each Our Father bead pray: "Eternal Father, I offer You the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins, and those of the whole world."

On each Hail Mary bead pray: "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us, and on the whole world." Repeat for five decades. To conclude, pray three times: "Holy God, holy mighty One, holy immortal One, have mercy on us, and on the whole world."

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (Cycle B) April 11, 2021

"These are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ...." John 20:31


Have you read and believed the <u>text</u> <u>messages</u> from God, concerning the Resurrection of His Son, Jesus?

In Luke 16:19-31, Jesus told a fascinating story about The Rich Man and Lazarus. There was a rich man who dressed in fine linen and feasted on great meals daily. Lazarus a beggar was covered with sores and laid at the rich man's gate. He wanted so much to eat the food that fell from the rich man's table. Both of them died. Lazarus was carried by angels to Abraham's bosom, but when the rich man died he was buried and in Hades [the realm of the dead] he lifted his eyes. The rich man was in torment and he could see in the distance Lazarus in Abraham's bosom. He called out and asked father Abraham to have mercy on him and to send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and come to cool his tongue; for he was engulfed in flames and in anguish. Abraham said to the rich man, "my child, remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad" Luke 16:25. Abraham explained that a great chasm was fixed between them so Lazarus couldn't pass over to his side anyway. He then asked Abraham to send Lazarus to his five brothers to warn them of this place of torment. Abraham said, "they [the five brothers] have Moses and the prophets let them listen to them" Luke 16:29. The rich man then said to Abraham, "Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent [amend their ways]" Luke 16:30. Abraham said, "if they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead" Luke 16.31

Since I was a child, I remembered hearing the story of the **Rich Man and Lazarus** read at Mass, and I would silently disagree with Abraham. I would say to myself if a dead person (that I knew) came back from the grave and told me to repent, I would believe and change my life. Then one day I read Matthew 28:16-17, which said the Risen Christ met with His eleven disciples in Galilee, "and when they saw Him they worshiped Him, but some doubted." Even though they saw that Jesus had come back from the dead, some still weren't convinced. Father Abraham was right; even if Lazarus had gone back to the rich man's brothers, they would have still doubted, just like Thomas in today's gospel.

Years ago, I missed a very important meeting because I didn't take the time and read **my text messages** on my iPhone. When it comes to the Lord, we need to **listen and believe** because He has already **texted us** about the Resurrection of His Son, Jesus. The **words of Moses and the Prophets** are contained in the **Hebrew Text**. Biblical scholars adhere that the Gospels and the Epistles were originally written in the **Greek Text**.

John's Gospel tells us that signs-including the **Resurrection of Jesus from the dead** was "written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and that through this belief you may have life in His name" John 20:31. We place so much value in everybody else text messages. We should **read and believe** in the **text messages from God.** $\sim\sim$ Deacon Jenkins













