

Two metaphors in today's readings describe Jesus. Peter, drawing upon the words of psalmist, calls Jesus the cornerstone. He leads and cares for his sheep, even sheep outside the fold, eventually laying down his life for them, for us. Let us reflect on how Jesus is our cornerstone and our shepherd.

"I am the good shepherd...and I lay down my life for the sheep...and they will heed my voice." - John 10:14-16 When you pray, do you only ask Jesus for the things that you want? Do you ever ask Him what He wants from you? How do you listen for His response? Many times Jesus responds in "quiet whispers" that are not so obvious. So, take time every day, in silence, to actively listen for His voice.

My Sheep Hear My Voice and They Follow Me

Happy 4th Sunday of Easter!
In the Gospel today, Jesus compares Himself to a

shepherd protecting His sheep, promising His disciples that He will hold them securely in His hands. Jesus illustrates His teaching by referring to shepherds and sheep. It's about the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep. Jesus is the shepherd, and we are His sheep. And He knows each of us by name.

And Jesus, as our Good Shepherd, is giving each of us a gift. He offers us the gift of eternal life. Jesus says, **"I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish."**

Jesus gives us eternal life by sacrificing His. Jesus serves us, His sheep. For sheep, usually it's the other way around.

You see, brothers and sisters, sheep are usually kept either to be eaten or turned into sweaters. The sheep are the sacrifice. But Jesus doesn't have that in mind for us, His sheep. He is not leaving us to be eaten up by the world as lamb chops. Jesus says that **"no one can take them out of my hand."**

The Good News today is that we are His. We are in His hands. We have His love. We are in His flock.

And, as members of His flock, we must listen to Jesus' voice. He says today, **"My sheep hear my voice, I know them, and they follow me."**

So, in order to have His gift of eternal life, we must listen to Jesus' voice and follow Him. We have to tune our minds to the sound of His voice. We must recognize Jesus' voice out of the many voices we may hear.

It reminds me of when I was young and how I recognized my mother's voice. I would be outside down the street playing with my friends and it would get late. My mother would call "Darryl!" and I knew it was her. I would stop what I was doing and run home.

So, here's the question, how do we know our Shepherd's voice? How do we know Jesus' voice?

As His sheep, there are various ways that we can hear Jesus' voice.

We can hear His voice in His Word.

In order to actually "hear" from God, we have to know some things about God's character. We have to develop an understanding of who God is, and the way He does things. He speaks to us when we read the Bible.

2 Timothy 3:16 says that all Scripture is **"God-breathed."**

His Word sometimes gives us a warning, a word of encouragement, or a lesson for life.

Have you ever had something on your heart and when you opened the bible and picked a passage, it spoke to that very thing that was on your heart? It has definitely happened to me.

Another way we can hear our Shepherd's voice is through others.

We can hear Jesus' voice in the voices of those we encounter. God will use other people to try to get through to us. God may use a friend, a teacher, a parent, or someone religious, to convey His message of truth to us. I can remember the many times God spoke to me through others. The many times God

was calling me to be a Deacon, I had the validation that He was calling me through others. He sent messages to me through sermons that I heard, through people I met in public, through friends and family, and even through Brother Eugene in our choir.

Another way we can hear our Shepherd's voice is through our inner voice.

Sometimes God speaks to us in the tiny voice inside of us. It could be that thought that keeps cropping up in our mind. The tiny voice could be telling us that we are not on the right path and need to go in a different direction. It could be telling us to pursue a calling that we have been resisting. The tiny voice could be Jesus telling us to go help someone who is in need.

Some people say, "my mind told me something" which is that inner voice.

The inner voice can be, at times, tough to discern whether it is our Shepherd's voice or OUR voice. And so how do we know?

This is where prayer is important. We pray and ask God if it is His voice that we are hearing and not our own. We must pray and ask God if it's His voice we are hearing and not the world's.

And this is another way that we can hear our Shepherd's voice. We can hear it through prayer and quiet time.

God often speaks to us through His Spirit, through prayer. Prayer is a conversation with God. We get to know God through prayer. It should be two way.

When we pray, then, we should also listen. We can listen when we have that quiet time with Him. We can pray and ask Him to speak to us. Then we have to sit still to listen. Setting aside the quiet time to hear his voice is probably the most challenging in today's world. We always have some sort of noise going on.

- For some of us, there is always a TV or music on.
- I know some guys that watch ESPN all day to keep up with sports.
- Some people watch CNN all day long to try to keep up with all of the news that our government is creating.
- For some, it's these smartphones that keep our attention.
- For some of our youth, it's video games or you tube.

So, if we want to hear His voice, we have to make time for Him by eliminating the 'noise'.

Brothers and Sisters, these are a few ways we can hear and **know our Shepherd's voice.**

Does God speak to all of us the same way? No, we are all unique. Are these the only ways God speaks today? No. He's a creative God. He speaks in so many ways, including through miracles, music, dreams, visions, etc.

Regardless of the way God chooses to reveal Himself or "speak" to us today, let us remember one truth. He will never contradict His Word, and the message He gives will always bring glory to God.

Let us be aware today that He speaks to us and let us be ever conscious that He can use all things to communicate with us...to follow Him, the Good Shepherd.

New Fully Online Marriage Preparation Program


